ILLNESS AT SCHOOL

As we are now into winter there are a few bugs around which affect our children as well as staff.

If your child is sick please keep them at home until they are well. If your child has diarrhoea or vomiting we ask that they do not return to school unless they are well and have had **no further diarrhoea or vomiting for 24 hours prior to returning – these bugs can be highly contagious.** Thank you for your assistance in this and for those families who are keeping their unwell children at home.

CHICKENPOX

We have begun the term with a number of students away with chickenpox. According to the Ministry of Health Infectious Diseases Guidelines:

- Early signs are a fever and spots with a blister on top of each spot.
- The child is infectious from up to 5 days before appearance of the rash until lesions have crusted (usually about 5 days).
- Time between exposure and sickness is 13-17 days.
- This disease is spread by coughing and sneezing and by direct contact with weeping blisters.
- Exclusion from school is approximately a week from the date of the appearance of the rash.

If you are unsure whether your child should return to school, please see to your family doctor.

MINISTRY OF HEALTH UPDATE MEASLES AT SCHOOLS IN OUR AREA

Since December 2013 there have been more than 140 confirmed cases of measles in New Zealand. In the past few weeks the majority of these cases have been in school aged children in the Waikato. Measles is a highly infectious disease that affects both adults and children. Measles is more serious than many people realise; of the recent cases in New Zealand over 30 have required hospital treatment. Measles starts with a fever, cough, runny nose and/or sore eyes followed a few days later by a rash. People are infectious from 5 days before to 5 days after the rash appears. Most of the recent cases have occurred in unimmunised people and immunisation, with two doses of the measles/mumps/rubella (MMR) vaccine, remains the best way to prevent infection and spread of measles within the community. Immunisation is free for New Zealand residents born after 1 January 1969 who have not previously received two doses of a measles containing vaccine. Unimmunised people exposed to measles will need to stay away from school for at least 14 days. So please encourage students, parents and staff to get immunised as soon as possible.

If someone develops symptoms of measles, separate them from others while they are waiting to be taken home and call Healthline on **0800 611 116** for advice as soon as possible.

UP-TO-DATE IMMUNISATION DETAILS

We encourage our families to check that your child/rens Immunisation details (*found under "My Child" then "Other Details" tab*) are correct through the parent portal at www.atschool.co.nz using the User ID and Passwords that will be provided with your child's Learning Plan. If you do not have access to a computer, or your child will not have a Learning Plan this time round, you are welcome to check your details with us on (07) 853-0039.

If you have changed any of your details i.e. phone, address, e-mail etc; please advise the School Office so we can update your records accordingly. **It is very important that we hold the current Immunisation information on file** (found in the back of the Plunket Book or from your family doctor). **Our school may be asked to provide a list to the Ministry of Health at any stage.**

TEACHERS AWAY

We have had quite a few Guest Teachers in the school lately. At this time of the year we are hit by illness, not only by children but also by teachers. In addition, teachers may be absent due to undertaking professional development. Although we do most of this "in house" in order to ensure teachers are not away from school, some courses are held in class time. In the past few weeks we have also had teachers being called upon for Jury Service. In previous years I was able to ask that they be exempt, however this is no longer an option and teachers have to attend.

We do have a great pool of regular "Guest Teachers" who support the school and continue our planned learning programmes for our children. Paula Wine, our Assistant Principal, schedules all of this and it can be a logistical challenge getting everything in place. If you see her coming to school a little later than usual it is because she has been busy getting everything organised!

My thanks go to our staff, and Guest Teachers who support the school and also, to our children who demonstrate those wonderful qualities of being respectful to our guests in the school.

NOTICES TO CHILDREN DURING SCHOOL HOURS

We are always pleased to help families at school, but we have noticed an increase from parents to get messages to children regarding after school arrangements. We are happy to do this in an extreme emergency but lately there has been an increase in the frequency of messages. This can often lead to disrupted learning times as classes have to be interrupted for the message to get thorough.
