Costs works out at \$10 a session (Which includes pool entry).

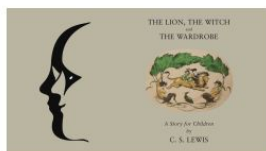
Divers should be confident in water and ideally at least 6 years old. (Exceptions are possible).
