SAFETY TO/FROM SCHOOL & AROUND DOGS

We have had a phone call from a concerned member of our community who uses the Chesham Street/Chadwick Place entrance to our school.

On occasion, there has been a large tan coloured bull mastiff type dog roaming the streets which is not very friendly. Animal Control are aware of this dog and have suggested that we inform our families and encourage them to take extra care within this area.

If you see a dog roaming without an owner, please call **Animal Control Ph: 07 838-6632** (save this number to your mobile phone). To help Animal

Control act accordingly (within the boundaries of the law), then they must be informed immediately.

Any dog roaming without an owner has the potential to cause serious harm. If you have a camera or mobile phone handy, it would be helpful to **take a photo of the dog** in question.

TE TOTARA BOARD OF TRUSTEES, WHAT THE BOARD ACTUALLY DOES AND WHY

The board is responsible for setting the direction of the school through its charter and policies. We are responsible for governance of the school, where as Brian, Anne and Paula (the Senior Leadership Team) are responsible for the Management of the School.

Governance determines the what (designing the future), the ends (the outcomes to be achieved) and the policies (statements of what's expected). Through a self review program, the Board measures the performance of the school and the principal against the plans set.

Why? Well, we strive for our children to achieve and continuously improve and progress. The Board is ultimately responsible to the Crown but also to you the schooling community, to ensure we meet the National Administration Guidelines (commonly called the NAGS) which are legislated statements of the boards responsibilities covering all areas of the schools operations.

At the end of July, our school roll was 748 and this is expected to continue to increase to around 800 by the end of the year. We have planned for this and have the capacity to house the students in modern fully equipped (technology wise) classrooms and capability with teachers that we are proud of and who are all high achievers. We are assessing priorities for infrastructure advancements, including considering a café, extension to the library and the refurbishment of the school field area. So please know, that to us, the members of the Board, the children are our greatest priority and we will continue to strive to ensure they have the best possible ability to achieve at Te Totara Primary School – a school we can all be proud of.
