WAIKATO BP TECHNOLOGY CHALLENGE CONGRATULATIONS

HUGE congratulations to the teachers and students involved in Tuesday's Waikato BP Technology Challenge. Every year the Royal Society of New Zealand in conjunction with BP put on a nationwide competition to promote design and technology in primary aged children. This year the Waikato area schools competition was held on Tuesday at the Hamilton Gardens and we entered a year 3-4 and 5-6 team.

The children were given a challenge to research, design and build prior to the event. Students were given a scenario, a list of materials (which was not much more than newspaper, tape and string), certain conditions and the judging criteria. The challenge was to build a 'birdfeeder' for native birds. Our teams were chosen after viewing all year 3-4's and 5-6's compete in challenges taken from the BP Challenge web site. Being selected to represent Te Totara School was in itself a huge achievement. When we came together we had 3 weeks to research, design and build our birdfeeder, but first the kids had to learn how to roll paper properly - this was no easy task! Competition day saw us turn up with two very different and very large birdfeeders compared to all the others schools. Judging began with the year 3-4's while they under took the mystery challenge, building a stretcher to carry a 5kg weight over an obstacle course. Next was the turn of the year 5-6's. While their feeder was judged they had to build a marble run. They received extra points for every turn they created and if the marble was able to hit a bulls eye when it rolled out. The year 3-4's finished with a 1st place in the birdfeeder competition. The year 5-6's finished 2nd in the birdfeeder competition and 1st in their "Mystery Challenge". Our children's research, ideas and construction and the fact they could justify their ideas in all those areas helped them gain these wonderful results.

A huge congratulation to all involved especially to our children.
