SWIMMING CLASS LESSONS 2016

Did you know?

New Zealand has one of the highest drowning rates in the developed world and unfortunately 2016 has seen many drownings in New Zealand already.

We are very lucky to be able to continue our school swimming programme in 2016. This is a vital part of our Te Totara Health and Physical Education curriculum. Our school pool is in fabulous condition with a new heat pump programmed for 30 degrees. We will be operating our 'in school' swimming programme from February to May and September to December each year. Our children will continue to learn from qualified instructors with a programme which includes aqua education, survival skills and swimming stroke work. Lessons will be held with small numbers of children in the classes which research shows is 'best practise' learning, your child will receive a block course of 2 weeks of swimming lessons for a very reasonable fee of \$60 per year. The fee will go towards employing our qualified swim instructors and the ongoing costs of keeping our school pool running. These costs are also subsidised by our curriculum budgets to ensure they are affordable for all. These fees can be paid over the year in instalments by automatic payment if you would like to. The students swimming progress will be monitored and you will receive a certificate of your child's ongoing progress and achievements.

SWIM SCHOOL LESSONS AFTER SCHOOL AT TE TOTARA

We are looking at running our swim school Lessons in Term 1 after school on Tuesday's and Wednesday's.

This is additional to your child's in school class lessons and a great way to boost your child's confidence in the water. At this stage our Tuesday lessons are fully booked, however we do have a few spaces left for Wednesday lessons.

This would be a 7 week block course, starting Tuesday 16th February 2016.

Fees are \$101.50 per child and lessons are 25 minutes each week.

Parents are reminded please to stay on site for your child's swim school lesson as per our swim School terms and conditions.

EARLY ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL BEFORE 8.15AM

Children are welcome to arrive at school from **8.15am onwards**. We have noticed a number of students arriving around 8.00am or even earlier. Teachers have planning to do before school in their classrooms and are unavailable to supervise any students arriving before 8.15am. We offer a Before School Care facility; Enrolment Forms are available from the School Office or via our School website www.tetotara.school.nz

LATE ARRIVALS (AFTER 8.55AM)

Have you ever arrived at a meeting late, everyone is settled in their chair, the presenter has welcomed them and is now outlining what the day has in store..... .and as you walk in they all turn and look at you?

That is what it can be like for your child when they arrive late at school and their class is all settled. So please, we ask parents to ensure their children arrive at school with at least five minutes to spare, for them to organise themselves by hanging up their school bag and sorting their book bag independently.

We understand there may be rare occasions where your child arrives **late** at school **(after 8.55am)** and require families to report to the School Office for the child to be issued a Late Card prior to heading to their learning areas. We appreciate your effort in ensuring your child/ren arrive at school in good time before the first bell at 8.55am.

PROCEDURE WHEN STUDENTS ARE AWAY DUE TO FAMILY HOLIDAY ETC

APPOINTMENTS AT SCHOOL

We love to see families at school and appreciate the home and school partnership. However, we are finding that that we have a number of "cold callers" arriving and expecting to see either a leadership person or a teacher. This can pose problems as we often have commitments elsewhere and can't do justice to any queries that you may have. We certainly don't want to stop the great communication in place, but would appreciate either a phone call or e-mail so that we can make an appointment to give you the time needed to sort out any queries. This phone call or e-mail will need to be done a day or two prior to the appointment.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

We are delighted with the large numbers of students who look really great by wearing their uniform in the correct manner.

However, we have noticed a few students who are not complying with our Uniform Expectations and we ask your assistance with this.

ALL students are expected to be wearing their full correct summer uniform.

- All students are to arrive at school and leave from school in their Te Totara Primary School uniform, including footwear.
- Uniforms are to be worn clean, neat and tidy.
- Students are encouraged to take pride in their school uniform and to wear it well.
- Hair is to be off the face, tied back if longer than the bottom of the collar, and be the natural hair colour.
- Nail polish and cosmetics are not permitted.
- Second hand uniforms may be available. Please see the notice board in the School Office for details.
- Any hair accessory is to be of a single school uniform colour red, white, black, green.
- Variations in relation to the Human Rights Act may be negotiated with the Principal.
- All pupils are encouraged to use sunscreen at home before school and expected to wear the regulation school hat while outdoors. No hat play in the shade.
- All uniform items should be clearly named.

JEWELLERY

Items of jewellery can be easily lost or damaged at school. They may also cause injury to the wearer or other students. **For safety reasons items of jewellery are NOT to be worn.** The school accepts no responsibility in the case of loss, damage or injury.

However, students may wear:

- a) One small earring stud per ear.
- b) A watch.
- c) A necklace of religious or cultural significance to be worn underneath clothing.
- d) A Medical Identification Tag as required.
