SIBLING OUT-OF-ZONE ENROLMENTS FOR THE PERIOD OF: 1ST JULY, 2016 TO 16TH DECEMBER, 2016

The Board of Trustees are looking to accommodate, if possible, New Entrant siblings and children of staff due to start school before between 1st July, 2016 and 16th December, 2016.

To help determine this, we **<u>urgently</u>** need to have all out-of-zone Enrolment Forms in to the School Office by

Friday 27TH May to help with this process. Enrolment Forms are available online from our school website or by visiting the School Office.

Shortly, the Board of Trustees will look at the number of enrolments, the level of predicted student growth and determine how many spaces for out-of-zone students may be available for the period of 1st July – 16th **December**, 2016. It is likely that 20 out-of-zone spaces will be available however; the exact number of out-of-zone spaces will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone. Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available on our school website <u>www.tetotara.school.nz</u>

Parents of new entrant children who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately.

More information will follow via the school newsletter. If a ballot is required, it will be held on <u>Wednesday 1st</u> <u>June, 2016</u>. Parents will be informed of the outcome by **Tuesday 7th June, 2016** (3 working days later - Monday 6th June is Queens Birthday Holiday).

ILLNESS AT SCHOOL

We have had a huge amount of children sick at school this week.
