Ticket prices are:


- \$10.00 Per adult (13 years and older)

Because of the number of classes involved (18 classes), we have split into two groups and have certain days that we are performing:

- Only <u>300 tickets</u> are available for each performance so don't miss out!.
- Doors open at 12.30pm for matinee & 6.30pm for evening performances.
- The number on your ticket is <u>NOT</u> your seat number. <u>Seating is on a first-come-first-served basis</u>. However, there will be wheelchair access with allocated seating if you require this service, please advise the School Office when purchasing your tickets.
- Main cast details for each show is available at the School Office.
- Please remember to bring your ticket to the performance; this will confirm you have purchased a seat.
- We acknowledge that some families may have children performing on both days and may have to purchase tickets for each of the days. Unfortunately, we cannot offer any solution to this as the money from ticket sales goes towards the costumes, lighting, sound, backdrops etc.
- For evening performances <u>Year 3-6</u> children can arrive back at school by <u>6:30pm</u> and go directly to Orion Block, where they will be supervised.
- Everyone will need to arrive at school with make-up (foundation and powder) on. MAIN CAST members will
  meet in the staff room by <u>6.15pm</u>.
- <u>All Year 3-6 students</u> are required to attend each of their own team performances.


