SCHOOL ASSEMBLY-CHANGE OF FORMAT

We hold a "School Assembly" each Friday, starting at 2.00pm in the Matariki Hall, where we celebrate learning and achievement, awards and school information updates. Families are very welcome to attend, our teachers endeavour to contact families if their child is gaining an award at the assembly.

Due to the number of students/families involved we are now moving to three separate assemblies to help with congestion and allow for a more informal approach. We mix the year and age levels up so that our older students are able to support and role model to our newer children. Teams will rotate in this format:

- A. Orion, Kōpū, Marama
- B. Matawhero, Earth, Milky Way
- C. Neptune, Ra

Each week we will include in the newsletter 'School Assembly' to inform you of which teams are attending assembly on that week.

SCHOOL ASSEMBLY

This week's assembly will be held on Friday 2nd February, 2018 in the Matariki Hall at 2.00pm.

This week our children from Orion, Kōpū & Marama will attend assembly.

This week we will be welcoming our new students from these classes.

HEAT PLAN

With the very hot weather we have introduced a Heat Plan at school. Usually our children go outside during the breaks to play with friends and enjoy the benefits of being active. We recognise that with the very hot weather this can pose some risks, especially around dehydration and heat related concerns. So on very hot days we will be having an indoor option for the children to use at break times, typically anything over 25 degrees in the forecast will trigger the Heat Plan.

We are fortunate that all our inside areas (apart from Matariki-Hall) are air conditioned so it allows for optimum learning and teaching conditions.

CAMP FOR OUR YEARS 5 & 6 STUDENTS

We enjoy giving our students at least one overnight camp at our school. We do try and make them toward the beginning of the school year, so those valuable relationships established, can be built on during the year. This year we are using the Ngaruawahia Christian Camp and our two teams are going on:

Milky Way Team Departing on Monday 12th February, returning on Wednesday 14th February

Marama Team Departing on Wednesday 14th February, returning on Friday 16th February

We were swamped with offers of help, which was very much appreciated. My thanks for parents who offered.

Our Teachers have been busy preparing and there is lots of planning information going home to the students from the two teams.

We have a tradition of the rest of the school farewelling the students as they leave, so if you are around school at the beginning of the school day on Monday 12 February and Wed 14 February, you'll see this in action.

CHICKENPOX

We have begun the term with a couple of students away with chickenpox. According to the Ministry of Health Infectious Diseases Guidelines:

- Early signs are a fever and spots with a blister on top of each spot.
- The child is infectious from up to 5 days before appearance of the rash until lesions have crusted (usually about 5 days).

- Time between exposure and sickness is 13-17 days.
- This disease is spread by coughing and sneezing and by direct contact with weeping blisters.
- Exclusion from school is approximately a week from the date of the appearance of the rash.

If you are unsure whether your child should return to school, please see your family doctor.

If access is denied, it is most likely that our school does not have your current email address recorded on your child's file. Please do not hesitate to contact the School Office on (07) 853-0039 to amend.

Below is some information for our families from the team at Kindo:

Kindo now offers payment by American Express, Mastercard, Visa or China UnionPay, by internet banking or by Account2Account (managed internet banking).POLi is coming soon! Card payments cost 50c+2.5% (a slight increase on last year) but other methods remain free of charge. You are welcome to add funds to your account regularly or in advance, or just pay as you go.

American Express is now accepted. Popular with many parents for their great rewards schemes, parents can now choose to top up their accounts by American Express, Mastercard, Visa or China UnionPay (popular with Chinese families), by internet banking or by Account2Account (managed internet banking). AVAILABLE NOW.

POLi is on it's way - we've been working hard to implement POLi payments over the holidays. An alternative to Account2Account, POLi is an internet banking-type service that is used by many large NZ businesses and government departments. COMING VERY SOON.

Credit Card fees increase - for the last 18 months or so our credit card merchant fees have been exceeding our fees recovery from parents. We've been negotiating to reduce these, but unfortunately we've been unsuccessful in getting any change to the rate. As such we increased the credit card fee we charge to parents, so we can recover those costs, from the current 2% to 2.5%. This is still a common amount charged for credit card usage and we are letting parents know on our website where they're choosing payment method. IMPLEMENTED ON 1 JANUARY, 2018.

Prezzy Card issue - we've been made aware late last week of an issue with Prezzy Cards failing for online purchases. Payment Express are working on a solution which will be in place in March. They have also made Prezzy aware of the failures, so we may see action sooner. As all of our payments are processed via Payment Express, unfortunately we will be unable to accept Prezzy Cards until this has been resolved.

Account 2Account continues to have sporadic issues with various banks, commonly the ASB Bank. If a parent raises an issue with our helpdesk we take this to Payment Express support to resolve. Sometimes clicking the 'back' button can also make it work. They continue to work towards greater stability. The implementation of POLi should provide a good alternative also.



SCHOOL SWIMMING, CLASS LESSONS FOR TERM 1, 2018

Our pool is looking great and ready for our school class lessons to start.

Our Year 2 children will be swimming this term and the timetables have been updated and are online on our website now. After our Year 2 students complete their swimming the Year 3-4 students will be swimming. We will put these timetables up on the website over the next few weeks.

CHANGE OF DETAILS/ADDRESS

SCHOOL HOURS

Just a reminder that school starts at **8.55am sharp** and it is important for children to be here at that time. We appreciate your efforts however; if for any reason you do arrive late (after 8.55am) please report to the School Office where a "Late Card" will be issued to your child before heading to your learning area.

EARLY ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL BEFORE 8.15AM

Children are welcome to arrive at school from **8.15am onwards**. We have noticed a number of students arriving around 8.00am or even earlier. Teachers have planning to do before school in their classrooms and are unavailable to supervise any students arriving before 8.15am. We offer a Before School Care facility; Enrolment Forms are available from the School Office or via our School website www.tetotara.school.nz

LATE ARRIVALS (AFTER 8.55AM)

Have you ever arrived at a meeting late, everyone is settled in their chair, the presenter has welcomed them and is now outlining what the day has in store..... and as you walk in they all turn and look at you?

That is what it can be like for your child when they arrive late at school and their class is all settled. So please, we ask parents to ensure their children arrive at school with at least five minutes to spare, for them to organise themselves by hanging up their school bag and sorting their book bag independently.

We understand there may be rare occasions where your child arrives late at school

(after 8.55am) and require families to report to the School Office for the child to be issued a Late Card prior to heading to their learning areas. We appreciate your effort in ensuring your child/ren arrive at school in good time before the first bell at 8.55am.

ALLERGIES/MEDICAL CONDITIONS

In the event of a medical emergency, if your child has a medical condition, is taking regular medicine/tablets or has an allergy (including sticking plasters etc), please advise the School Office (if you haven't already), so we can amend your records accordingly.

We also have several children in school with allergies and we have procedures in place to keep these children safe, including not sharing food/drink, washing tables, and hand washing before and after eating. Thank you for your cooperation in these matters.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

We are delighted with the large numbers of students who look really great by wearing their uniform in the correct manner.

However, we have noticed a few students who are not complying with our Uniform Expectations and we ask your assistance with this.

ALL students are expected to be wearing their full correct summer uniform.

- · All students are to arrive at school and leave from school in their Te Totara Primary School uniform, including footwear.
- · Uniforms are to be worn clean, neat and tidy.
- · Students are encouraged to take pride in their school uniform and to wear it well.
- · Hair is to be off the face, tied back if longer than the bottom of the collar, and be the natural hair colour.
- · Nail polish and cosmetics are not permitted.
- · Second hand uniforms may be available. Please see the notice board in the School Office for details.
- · Any plain hair accessory is to be of a single school uniform colour red, white, black, green.
- · Variations in relation to the Human Rights Act may be negotiated with the Principal.
- · All pupils are encouraged to use sunscreen at home before school and expected to wear the regulation school hat while outdoors. No hat play in the shade.
- · All uniform items should be clearly named.
- Plain black school sandals in summer (Terms 1&4) OR plain black school shoes in winter (Terms 2&3). No other colours on the sandal or shoe, just plain black.

JEWELLERY

Items of jewellery can be easily lost or damaged at school. They may also cause injury to the wearer or other students. For <u>safety reasons items of jewellery are NOT to be worn</u>. The school accepts no responsibility in the case of loss, damage or injury.

However, students may wear:

- a) One small earring stud per ear.
- b) A watch.
- c) A necklace of religious or cultural significance to be worn underneath clothing.
- d) A Medical Identification Tag as required.
