#### **EDUCATION REVIEW OFFICE (ERO) REPORT**

In November 2017, ERO visited our school. This is the Government agency that reviews all schools to examine the quality of education provided.

We are delighted with the report about the school and the acknowledgement of the work being done for our children. There are a large number of very positive affirmations about the school and three agreed next steps, to continue on what we are doing. We have included these in our draft 2018 Annual Plan which will be finalised shortly. The school is determined to continue to develop and be proactive moving forward.

The school has been placed on a four-five year return visit time frame due to our performance, this is for schools deemed to have high quality performance. 15% of Schools have attained this and 8% have achieved this in consecutive reviews. Our school has achieved a four-five year return time in consecutive reviews.

The criteria that has been used to determine this, from 2012 - 2017...

ERO will next review the school in four-to-five years where it finds that the school's curriculum is consistently effective in promoting student learning - engagement, progress and achievement.

High quality performance will be evident and ERO will have no material concerns about the education and safety of students.

Overall, the school will convincingly demonstrate that:

- Learners experience a coherent and rich curriculum that provides them with relevant choices and pathways and supports their successful transition through schooling and on to further education and training
- Learners are actively engaged in their learning, and are progressing and achieving well; and the progress of priority groups of learners is being accelerated
- Maori learners are actively engaged in their learning, progressing and achieving well and succeeding as Maori
- There is a well-sustained culture of high expectations for students and staff
- A school-wide culture of rigorous critical reflection and self review contributes effectively to sustaining the school's positive performance and continuous improvement
- Leadership is highly effective and strategic, and is consistently improving student learning and achievement
- Teaching consistently demonstrates high quality practices, makes very good use of student achievement information, and is highly effective in promoting outcomes for learners
- The school has taken all reasonable steps to provide a safe and inclusive environment
- Governance is highly effective in self review, direction setting, decision-making and ensuring school accountabilities are met
- The school is highly effective in engaging the community in partnerships for learning and in the life of the school

#### **ERO STATISTICAL INFORMATION 2012 - 2017**

- Schools are placed on different return times due to their performance, either a 4-5 year return for high quality performance, 3 year return for good performance or 1-2 year return
- 15% of schools had a 4-5 year return time
- 73% of schools had a 3 year return time
- 11% of school had a 1-2 year return time
- 1% of schools had other reviews
- Of those schools with a 4-5 year return time, 8% of total schools had consecutive 4-5 year return times
- Te Totara Primary School has had consecutive 4-5 year return times in 2013 and January 2018.



#### **SCHOOL DONATION**

#### CAR PARKING, SAFETY OF OUR CHILDREN

Thanks so much to almost everyone who takes care around the school, on behalf of our children, many thanks. Some tips to make sure we have a safe school:

- · Parking in Disabled car parks is not permitted at any time unless you have a current "Disabled Parking" permit on display in your vehicle. We have a number of families who legitimately require these car parks.
- · We are noticing a few parents parking their cars on the cobblestones/footpath when picking up and dropping off children to and from school rather than on the driveway, particularly in front of the Administration Block.
  - Unfortunately, this is creating a problem with the cobblestones lifting, and the kerb cracking, so we would really appreciate your support.

#### Ways you can help....

- · When the weather is fine, please encourage your child/ren to scooter, bike or walk to school.
- · Arrive at 3.12pm less traffic, parking is easier, less stress all round.
- · Smile and accept that a few minutes wait is better than a lifetime of misery because one of our children has been injured or something worse has happened.

#### DROP-OFF & PICK-UP ZONE 8.15am-9.00am & 2.40pm-3.15pm

Please note that the drop-off zone is for you to drive in, drop-off (or pick-up) your children and depart. We ask that you do not park and leave your car as this causes a backlog of vehicles, this area is designed to keep traffic flowing. You are welcome to use the carpark beside the Matariki Hall if you wish to visit your child's classroom.

#### **FOOD AT SCHOOL - ALLERGIES**

We have children at our school who are highly allergic to dairy products and nuts and exposure to these foods could potentially be life threatening to them. We have procedures in place for 1:1 support for these children to ensure their safety. Below is some information for our families from the team at Kindo:

Kindo now offers payment by American Express, Mastercard, Visa or China UnionPay, by internet banking or by Account2Account (managed internet banking).POLi is coming soon! Card payments cost 50c+2.5% (a slight increase on last year) but other methods remain free of charge. You are welcome to add funds to your account regularly or in advance, or just pay as you go.

American Express is now accepted. Popular with many parents for their great rewards schemes, parents can now choose to top up their accounts by American Express, Mastercard, Visa or China UnionPay (popular with Chinese families), by internet banking or by Account2Account (managed internet banking). AVAILABLE NOW.

POLi is on it's way - we've been working hard to implement POLi payments over the holidays. An alternative to Account2Account, POLi is an internet banking-type service that is used by many large NZ businesses and government departments. COMING VERY SOON.

Credit Card fees increase - for the last 18 months or so our credit card merchant fees have been exceeding our fees recovery from parents. We've been negotiating to reduce these, but unfortunately we've been unsuccessful in getting any change to the rate. As such we increased the credit card fee we charge to parents, so we can recover those costs, from the current 2% to 2.5%. This is still a common

amount charged for credit card usage and we are letting parents know on our website where they're choosing payment method. IMPLEMENTED ON 1 JANUARY.2018.

Prezzy Card issue - we've been made aware late last week of an issue with Prezzy Cards failing for online purchases. Payment Express are working on a solution which will be in place in March. They have also made Prezzy aware of the failures, so we may see action sooner. As all of our payments are processed via Payment Express, unfortunately we will be unable to accept Prezzy Cards until this has been resolved.

Account2Account continues to have sporadic issues with various banks, commonly the ASB Bank. If a parent raises an issue with our helpdesk we take this to Payment Express support to resolve. Sometimes clicking the 'back' button can also make it work. They continue to work towards greater stability. The implementation of POLi should provide a good alternative also.
