COMMUNICATING WITH YOU

We do like to keep everyone up-to-date. As well as our newsletter, Facebook page and School App we are increasingly using <u>Seesaw</u> as a tool for teachers to communicate with homes as well as our children sharing valuable learning. The School has purchased a licence for each child so that all the previous information is kept and not lost at the end of the year. We have been delighted with the uptake and encourage families to keep using this tool.

To further help and support the use of Seesaw, we are updating our guidelines for how/what/when it is used, so that students, families and school staff all know. We are aiming to get these guidelines completed by the end of the term and published for everyone. I'll keep you posted on this.

NZCER RESEARCH PROJECT

Kia ora, Kia orana, Malo e lelei, Talofa lava, Taloha ni, Ni sa bula vinaka, Fakaalofa atu and greetings from the New Zealand Council for Education Research.

Early in Term 2, our school will be participating in a research project lead by NZCER and The Marie Clay Literacy Trust. The project aims to establish up to date statistics about the reading and writing of 5-7 year olds in New Zealand. Many teachers use this information to help guide their teaching.

This research will involve 10 of our students (selected randomly) completing some reading and writing tasks with a visiting research assistant.

The research assistants are all registered senior teachers or reading recovery teachers

The research assistant will be working one on one with each child and are all experienced at working sensitively with students on the tasks that will be part of this study. The tasks will take about 50 minutes to complete but students can ask to stop any time if they need to.

The research results are anonymous

Your child's name and our school will not be identifiable in the research information or any reports created from this project.

You can choose to opt your child out of this study

If you have a child at school, between 5-7 years old, and you **do not** want him/her to be part of the research project, please contact the School Office.

OUT-OF-ZONE ENROLMENTS PERIOD FOR 2018

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available on our school website www.tetotara.school.nz

The Board has determined that <u>5 places for Year 1 students</u> and <u>15 places for New Entrant</u> (<u>Year 0</u>) <u>students</u>, whose 5th Birthday falls within the enrolment period of 1st July 2018 - 14th December 2018, are likely to be available to out-of-zone students

The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

The deadline for receipt of out-of-zone applications is **3.00pm on Friday 4th May, 2018 (tomorrow)** and should be addressed to:

Parents of students who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for this year. Students who live in the home zone are entitled to enrol at the school.

Applications from out-of-zone students will be processed in the following order of priority:

- a) **First priority** must be given to students who have been accepted for enrolment in a special programmes) run by the school and approved by the Secretary of Education*.
 - * This priority is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Ministry of Education
- b) Second priority must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a current student of the school.
- c) Third priority must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a former student of the school.
- d) Fourth priority must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- e) **Fifth priority** must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the Board of the school, or a child of a member of the Board of the school.
- f) Sixth priority must be given to all other applicants.

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot supervised by a Justice of the Peace, a Practicing Lawyer or a Police Officer in accordance under Section 11G (1) of the Education Act 1989.

If a ballot for out-of-zone is required, it will be held on <u>Tuesday 8th May, 2018</u>. Parents will be informed of the outcome by **Friday 11th May, 2018**.
