FAMILY SURVEY FEEDBACK

Firstly our thanks for the 160 families, including children and parents who completed the survey at the end of the 2017 year. Also, our apologies for not getting back to you earlier with feedback. We have been working on a few ideas behind the scenes, especially in relation to the uniform.

Number of Surveys received: 160

What do you like about Te Totara? The main points that came up:

- Teachers/Staff -friendly, informative, passionate, lovely, nice & helpful
- Principal caring, involved, present, friendly & approachable
- **School Environment -** nice atmosphere, community feel, STARS, inclusive, colourful, positive, organised, great communication, Senior Leadership
- School PE gear, playgrounds, back field, pool, school app, ASC & BSC, library, seesaw, opportunities for senior students for leadership
- PTA Ice block days, Discos

What could we do to improve and how would it help? Main points:

- More parking
- Change white shirt to red
- Another playground may be a Year 5&6 playground
- EFL- needs to be longer ie 15mins minimum

Other suggestions:

More gear for PE shed, cleaner toilets, Learning Plan Discussions longer - too rushed at the moment

Of those that replied with a rating

- 99.3% (146/147) rated the School either Very Good or Excellent
- 0.7 %(1/147) rated the School as Ok/Not Good

What are we doing as a result of the survey? Parking

There is little that we can do about the parking. Lately, we have tried a new way of students waiting at the front of the school, rather than under the Te Totara Primary School sign for pick ups. This seems to allow for a quicker flow and we appreciate the positive behaviour from motorists and students.

<u>Uniform</u>

We have been looking closely at the response to the uniform colour around the white shirts and have been liaising with our supplier on this.

The Board will survey families early in 2019 in relation to the colour of the shirts, when the current contract finishes at the end of 2019, ready for the 2020 school year.

Playground

Alongside our wonderful PTA we are in the process to get this done. Currently our Student Council are coming up with a design brief and are hopeful to go out to tender within the next few months. The playground would be located between Matariki (Hall) and Orion.

EFL (Eating for Learning)

Currently we allocate 10 minutes for this at morning tea and break, we do realise that it can take a little longer for some to eat. Each teacher is able to make provision for this to make sure they eat.

Learning Plan Discussions Longer

We do find that the current system works for most, if needed another time can be made to go over things that may not be covered. Our teachers are available in their rooms at 8.30am each day for a quick catch up and will respond within 48 hours by email on a query.

Gear for PE Shed

We do endeavour to keep enough stock on hand and will continue to monitor when there is a need to purchase more equipment. Our Student Leaders do a great job in helping with issues and returns. We did find about 50 balls in the drainage system and have now installed a grate so we get to keep them in circulation!

Toilets

We are delighted with our cleaners and their work, we do find that during the school day that with lots of use they can be in need of a clean. Our two wonderful caretakers now check these during the day and can spot clean if needed.

SCHOOL CROSS COUNTRY - TUESDAY 14TH AUGUST, 2018

Once again it is that time of year when our children are training hard for our School Cross-Country. This is to be held on **Tuesday 14th August**, **2018 (Week 4, Term 3)**. Running is a fantastic sport to be involved in at any age. It brings many rewarding benefits, including the obvious physical, mental and personal development. It teaches children goal setting and helps build perseverance and resilience. **Regular**



physical exercise has also been shown to increase general well-being and reduce anxiety. Our students are currently working on increasing their fitness with circuit training and various fun endurance games and activities where their heart rate is elevated for extended periods of time. Students at all levels of fitness will be catered for, as the focus is on improving fitness and increasing stamina for each individual student - from whatever their current fitness level is. Parents, like teachers and coaches, play a key role in determining the quality of experiences young people have.
