CHARTER SURVEY 2019

Our Board of Trustees works with its local community to make sure that Te Totara Primary School operates in a way that is appropriate for the students, families and community that it serves. This is what schools mean when they talk about "the needs and aspirations of the local community"

The Board and School Leadership creates the school Charter and Strategic Plan. These describe the Board's long term plans for the school and sets goals that will help make them happen. They are generally for between 3-5 years.

The Board then monitors progress towards the long-term plan and goals to make sure the things that are happening in the school are going in the right direction. Our current Charter is for the 3 year period of 2017 - 2019, click on the following link to view this document: Charter 2017 - 2019

As we are coming to the end of this Charter period we need to consult with our students, staff and families around the next Charter which will be 2020 - 2023. Under our Treaty of Waitangi commitment we also consult with our Maori community.

Te Totara Primary encourages all our families to take part in a short survey to share ideas that will contribute to our Charter (the 'big picture' ideas), the Strategic Plan (the implementation plan) and the Annual year by year detail. CHANGES IN ROADING AROUND THE SCHOOL

Over the holidays the extension between Hector Drive and Kimbrae Drive has now been opened for use. This means that the vehicles using our "Drop-off Zone" are now able to turn left onto Hector Drive if they wish to continue up to Kimbrae Drive.

In order to do that safely we need any vehicle intending to turn LEFT out of our drop-off zone to please use the closest lane to the school, thus not cutting in front of other traffic who are turning right onto Hector Drive.

<u>Both</u> lanes are still able to be used as <u>right turn lanes</u> back onto Hector Drive, as they have always done. The Senior Leadership of the school directs afternoon traffic in this area which generally flows very well, even on the wet days.
