This is Milo, a Cavoodle who is in training to be Te Totara's support dog. Cavoodles are a cross between a Cavalier King Charles Spaniel and a Poodle. They are a small dog breed that have a low-shed coat and are very friendly.

LOCATION AND LOCKING OF BIKES AND SCOOTERS

Unfortunately, we have recently been advised by some of our neighbouring schools about current theft occurring with bikes and scooters. Last week we were also the victim of theft of a scooter at the fence line between the Matawhero and Earth block. We have reviewed our protocols in this area and have made some changes to decrease the risk of this happening.

Although we do have security cameras scattered throughout the school our best advice is to PLEASE

LOCK YOUR CHILD'S BIKE OR SCOOTER.

Note: Individual scooters are extremely difficult to view on CCTV as the image is unclear after zooming in. There are 100's of scooters parked along the fenceline at any one time

If your child intends to play on the playground after school for a short time, please ask them to go and get their bike/scooter first and have it with them.

We would expect that all of our children who are not enrolled at After School Care would have left the school premises by 3.15pm.







ALL SCOOTERS NORMALLY PARKED ON THE FENCE LINE BETWEEN MATAWHERO & THE EARTH POD ARE TO BE MOVED

Scooters normally parked in this area of our school will need to be parked over on the internal fence line beside the Marama block instead.

The reason for this is to prevent the theft of scooters from this area of our school grounds, as surveillance there is limited.

Our Caretakers will be onsite on Monday morning by the Matawhero pod fence line to help our younger students with the transition to this new designated area.

Any scooters throughout the school <u>without a locking device</u>, that is used properly <u>by your child</u>, must be parked on the internal fence beside the Marama (yellow) block. All bikes that come to school must have a locking device that is used correctly by your child, so they can be secure on the bike racks during the school day.



RIDING OF BIKES WITHIN SCHOOL GROUNDS

Just a reminder that both children and adults <u>are not permitted</u> to ride their bike within the school grounds. For the safety of everyone, please hop off your bike and walk beside it. This is because we have a lot of people moving through the school at key times so Health and Safety protocols do need to be enforced.

DROP-OFF/PICK-UP ZONE ROAD RULES AND SPEED LIMIT

This area is a great place to quickly drop off and pick up your children. Just a reminder to all our families that the speed limit is **5kms per hour in our drop-off/pick-up zone**. We have had some 'close calls' recently so it is really important that we stick to the 5km per hour speed limit. Most of our community do a wonderful job in looking after our students in this situation however, I am very aware that speed can creep up, therefore we do need to frequently remind our families of this safety protocol. **Ultimately, it is the driver's responsibility to look both ways for children who may be crossing before driving off.... children can be very**



unpredictable at times. We do have staff rostered on duty in the drop-off zone in the mornings however this is not until 8:30am as they have preparation work to do beforehand. Please note, current road rules also apply upon entering our drop-off/pick-up zone regarding positioning yourselves in the correct lane for turning out onto Hector Drive. At this stage the left lane closest to our school buildings is still able to be used for right turning as well. When leaving the drop-off zone if you wish to turn left onto Hector Drive, please position yourself in the LEFT LANE only, closest to the school buildings. The RIGHT LANE should be for cars turning right out onto Hector Drive. We have seen a few near miss accidents with cars crossing through lanes without indicating and not considering other drivers.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

We have also introduced a red waterproof jacket which is an optional school uniform item.

If you child plays in one of our after school or weekend sports teams, the jacket may also be worn to their sports games.

We expect our children to be wearing the correct everyday school uniform by next week - Monday 1st March, 2021.

SUBURBS COMMUNITY

Should we make Korikori Green a street for people?

Have your say on whether a section of Korikori Green is declared a pedestrian mall. A pedestrian mall is a street for people, meaning you can still walk, cycle, scooter or park on Korikori Green, but through vehicle access between North City Road and Kimbrae Drive would be restricted. The restrictions would be in place 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, except when there are events in Korikori Park or the immediately surrounding area. This proposed change aligns with the Rototuna Village developments and supports the overall vision of developing an attractive and sustainable community in Rototuna.
