She is looking forward to working with the students in Term 4. We are working on a transition process with Julia and Kobe so that the students and their families are very secure with this change. The learning will carry on in the same manner with the support of our great Orion teaching team.

We wish both Nerida and Julia well with this exciting new stage of their lives. We are a family-focused school, it is lovely to share these special occasions with our staff. It is so exciting when we have our staff and their gorgeous babies visit us for morning tea.

Last week we farewelled **Becky Somerville** (Whaea Becky) from our staff as she takes up her new position as Deputy Principal at Rototuna Junior High School. Becky has been at Te Totara since 2009, our second year of operation. She had a significant impact on our school in the area of Tikanga and Te Reo Maori by working with our staff to grow their own knowledge in this area. She fostered strong connections with our whanau and our Kapa Haka groups. Becky was also a Team Leader for a few years before winning a position across our Kaahui Ako Community of Learning cluster. She worked in the Learning Support area with our E.S.O.L. students and families.

We acknowledge her leadership skills at Te Totara and very much support her move to Rototuna Junior High School, as the school we contribute most of our students to. Te Totara Primary will maintain our close links with Becky and we know that she will particularly 'look out' for our students.

I am delighted to support Becky as the manahiri alongside Richard Crawford (Kaahui Ako Lead Principal) at Becky's welcoming powhiri this Friday morning at Rototuna High Schools. I will take our community's best wishes to this occasion.

### A word of warning from Te Totara Primary School Board of Trustees

Our school pick-up/drop-off zone and car park is extremely busy with many vehicles forming a queue on Hector Drive to turn left into it. This queue can be very long at times.

This is a message to those people who drive their vehicles on the wrong side of the road to get past these queued cars. This also includes cars being driven over the crossing on the wrong side of the road.

There is absolutely no excuse for this now as cars can enter Hector Drive from the opposite end, off Kimbrae Drive.

Driving in the above manner has previously been considered to be "dangerous overtaking" within the meaning of Section 7 of the Land Transport Act 1998. The penalty for this offence is disqualification from driving for six months and a maximum penalty of imprisonment for up to three months or a fine not exceeding \$4,500.

This is a warning that Police will be spoken to about monitoring this part of the roadway and the behaviour of those driving cars in the manner above. Whether the Police prosecute drivers for dangerous driving will be a matter for them.

The behaviour puts at risk the safety of our children and this is an unacceptable one as far as the Board and School are concerned.

### SIBLING OUT-OF-ZONE ENROLMENTS FOR 2022 Enrolment Period of 15th December, 2021 to 30th June, 2022

The Board of Trustees are looking to accommodate, if possible, younger siblings and children of staff in the 2022 school year. To help determine this, we urgently need to have Out-of-zone Enrolment Forms into the School Office to help with this process. Please complete an OUTZ Enrolment Form for each child, which is available online from our school website by clicking on the following link: <u>www.tetotara.school.nz</u> or by visiting the School Office.

The Board will look at the number of enrolments, the level of projected student growth and determine how many spaces for out-of-zone students are available for the upcoming enrolment period of **15th December**, **2021 to 30th June**, **2022**. This will be completed mid October, allowing for lots of time for families to know what is happening. Further information around the number of out-of-zone spaces to be released will be communicated via the school newsletter over the next few weeks.

Please return the completed OUTZ Enrolment Form, including the relevant documentation, to the School Office by <u>Friday 20th August, 2021</u>.

#### FAMILY HOLIDAYS TAKEN DURING TERM TIME

From time-to-time we have families who wish to take their children out of school for a family holiday during term time. A new "G" Attendance Code has been introduced by the Ministry of Education (MOE) to keep track of these "unjustified" absences.

"G" Code Definition as per the MOE: When a student is on a New Zealand or overseas holiday during the school term, the absence is unjustified. A parent's note does not provide justification.

Our school would prefer family holidays to be taken outside of term time, we have approx. 12 weeks of school holidays available each year to do so. Events like a Birthday aren't considered a valid reason for your child/ren being away from school either.

We do appreciate there may be some circumstances beyond the control of families whereby children will need to be away during term time, in this instance simply notifying the teacher/school verbally that your family is going on holiday is not sufficient.

Our school procedure is to email the Principal with the dates your child/ren will be absent from school and the reason why.

Your email will be acknowledged and the Attendance Register will be coded as a"G" during their absence from school. We regularly monitor student absence.

#### Does my child have to go to school every day?

Yes, your child must go to school every day. Under the Education Act 1989, parents and carers of school children up to 16 years old can be prosecuted if their child is away from school without a good reason.

#### Why do they need to go every day?

Going to school every day really is the key to getting the best out of school because:

- It sets up good habits for going to school right from day one
- Learning to read, write and do maths takes a lot of practice and is easier to master if your child goes to school regularly
- Each day is a chance to learn something new
- School offers your child regular, dedicated help to master the many skills they need
- It teaches your child life skills like commitment, being reliable, having a good work ethic and sticking with things when they get hard.
