EDUCATION REVIEW OFFICE (ERO) REPORT

Recently we were visited by ERO, the Government organisation that looks at school performance. We are delighted with their findings.

ERO will next review the school in four-to-five years where it finds that the school's curriculum is consistently effective in promoting student learning – engagement, progress and achievement. According to ERO..."approximately 12 percent (of NZ schools) are on a four-to-five year return time when they can demonstrate exceptional performance."

Overall, the school will convincingly demonstrate that:

- learners experience a coherent and rich curriculum that provides them with relevant choices and pathways and supports their successful transition through schooling and on to further education and training
- learners are actively engaged in their learning, and are progressing and achieving well; and the progress of priority groups of learners is being accelerated
- Māori learners are actively engaged in their learning, progressing and achieving well and succeeding as Māori
- there is a well-sustained culture of high expectations for students and staff
- a school-wide culture of rigorous critical reflection and self review contributes effectively to sustaining the school's positive performance and continuous improvement
- leadership is highly effective and strategic, and is consistently improving student learning and achievement
- teaching consistently demonstrates high quality practices, makes very good use of student achievement information, and is highly effective in promoting outcomes for learners
- the school has taken all reasonable steps to provide a safe and inclusive environment
- governance is highly effective in self review, direction setting, decision-making and ensuring school accountabilities are met

 the school is highly effective in engaging the community in partnerships for learning and in the life of the school.

SWIMMING TERM 2

Over the last few weeks we have been busy liaising with Waterworld at Te Rapa over our swimming programme, some FAQ's below may help...

Why do we go to Waterworld?

Swimming is a vital skill to learn in New Zealand and it is important that our children can swim. We have far too many drownings and NZ children are often around water, so swimming is an important skill. They have qualified instructors who can really help!

How is it organised?

This year we are going by classes and the sessions will be for 40 minutes each day (longer than 20 minutes last year).

Is it all about swimming?

Lots of it is about swimming, but also the experience of travelling to another place, going on a bus, relating to others and demonstrating those fantastic skills our children have.

When they are at the pool there will be some down time waiting for the bus, what will happen?

Waterworld are providing their studio for us to use, this is an inside private room and teachers will have learning activities for everyone. Outdoor facilities are also available if needed.

What happens if my child goes to swimming club, will they be catered for?

Yes, please e-mail their Swim School and level at that school, to: principal@tetotara.school.nz by Friday 10 May. I will pass this onto Waterworld and they will use this for their planning.

The first session

The first session the tutors will be using the information from parents on swim schools and also school information as well as their own, looking at the children to support groupings, so please don't be worried on the first day if your child comes home with concerns about groupings.

What transport is being used to ensure that my child is safe?

We are hiring one bus (instead of two last year) to shuttle back and forth, with three return trips during the day. This is through Kidventure who are licensed to carry 63 children. We have checked with another school on the service and safety and had excellent feedback.

What will the cost be?

- We have worked hard to get good bus pricing and pricing will be less than last year, it is \$6 a day, last year it was \$34
- For most Rooms the cost is \$30 a week....except for
- Rooms 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, & 12 it will be \$24 due to Queens Birthday holiday. We have tried hard to get an extra day but can't due to previous bookings and the fact the school has taken more space than originally allocated due to extreme roll growth. Cost is adjusted for this

I would like to see the programme in action, can I go?

Yes, but children are required to go by bus. Children are under the care of the school. Please don't purchase food or drinks at the shop for them, send food along in their bag.

What about food for the children?

Just send along morning tea and lunch as usual and the teachers will make sure the children get to eat. With lots of energy being used you might like to pack a little more energy food so their batteries don't run out! Please do not send money to buy from the shop as we will not be allowing children to use this, we expect them to bring lots of food.

What clothes should they wear?

Something warm, also, please **make sure clothing is named**. As you can imagine, lots of children and uniforms make it a challenge to get unnamed clothing to the right person.

A plastic bag for wet togs and towel helps. If your child has swimming goggles please send those as well, and ensure they are named.

My child has special needs, how will they be catered for.

Paula Wine, our Assistant Principal is contacting parents direct so that appropriate arrangements can be made to support.

My child is away for a day when they were due to swim, do I have to pay?

We have had to pre book and pay for the Bus and Instructors so we really aren't in a position to assist.

I don't want my child to be involved in this?

We do expect all our children to be involved as part of their learning.
