

#### PINK SHIRT DAY (MUFTI DAY) - FRIDAY 19TH MAY

Celebrated annually around the globe, Pink Shirt Day began in Canada in 2007 when two students took a stand against bullying, after another student was bullied for wearing a pink shirt. In Aotearoa, Pink Shirt Day aims to create schools, workplaces and communities where all people feel safe, valued and respected.

### Principal's Message

Please read the important message below regarding school attendance. You may have seen in the media recently the major concern about school attendance which has been dropping since 2015 (well before Covid). It would be easy to think that this is an issue for other schools however, we do have attendance concerns and have set goals for improvement in our Strategic Planning as well.



Achievement success at school depends on <u>regular school attendance</u> so the learning is consistent and targeted to the needs of your children.

#### WHAT DOES REGULAR ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL MEAN?

Being at school everyday matters. The more knowledge ākonga (learners) get at school, the more choices they will have when they leave.

Those missing school more frequently are likely to have bigger gaps in their learning which is why it is important to know how often individual students miss school. To do this, schools are required to provide attendance data to the Ministry of Education which is analysed each term, each student is allocated to one of four attendance categories:

- Regular attendance: students with over 90% attendance
   (missing fewer than five days of school in a standard 10-week term)
- Irregular absence: students with more than 80% and up to 90% attendance (students missing 5 9 1/2 days of a standard term)
- Moderate absence: students with more than 70% and up to 80% attendance (missing 10 14 1/2 days of school in a term)
- Chronic absence: students 70% attendance or less (missing 15 days or more of school in a term)

These categories tell us how often students are attending school each term, and how many are missing school frequently, but provide no information on why they do not attend.

There is a Ministry of Education expectation of <u>90% and above</u> for "regular attendance" for **each child** in New Zealand schools. Only **67.2** % of our school community currently reach that expectation.

We receive reports on our attendance rates, these are analysed for trends. In our Annual Plan for 2023 (available on our website) we have Attendance Goals set to lift attendance each year 2023 - 2025.

#### FAMILY HOLIDAYS TAKEN DURING TERM TIME

We have noticed a trend of parent condoned holidays taken during the school term. Please consider the effect this has on your child's learning by taking holidays at this time.

In general terms the Ministry of Education expects families to schedule holidays during the approved school holiday breaks.

We have approximately 12 weeks of school holidays available each year to do so. Events like a Birthday aren't considered a valid reason for your child/ren being away from school either.

We do appreciate there may be some circumstances beyond the control of families whereby children will need to be away during term time, in this instance simply notifying the teacher/school verbally that your family is going on holiday is not sufficient.

Our school procedure is to email the Principal with the dates your child/ren will be absent from school and the reason why.

Your email will be acknowledged and the Attendance Register will be coded as a"G" during their absence from school. This code is one of the codes classified by the Ministry of Education as an 'unjustified absence.' We regularly monitor student absence and report to the Ministry of Education weekly and at the end of each term.

#### Does my child have to go to school every day?

Yes, your child must go to school every day. Under the Education Act 2020, parents and carers of school children up to 16 years old can be prosecuted if their child is away from school without a good reason.
