Students will need to look their best, so please ensure the correct school uniform is worn and that it is in a clean condition.

SIBLING PHOTOS

Sibling Photos involving <u>pre-schoolers/older siblings</u> <u>not at our school</u> will be taken between <u>8.15am</u>-<u>9.00am on a first-come-first-served basis</u> on Wednesday 23rd October in the Matariki Hall.

<u>Students with siblings at school will have their photo</u> taken during class time.

If you wish to have a sibling photograph, Prepaid Sibling Envelopes can be collected from the School Office to complete and return to school <u>BEFORE</u> Photo Day.

This year Te Totara Primary School photographs will be available for you to view and order Online with PhotoLife Studios.

Your son or daughter will shortly bring home an online slip with their unique Shoot Key detailed on it. This Shoot Key will display all the photographs of your child, <u>including an individual photo</u>. It is then an easy process for you to shop on-line and purchase the photographs you want.

If you place your order within three weeks of receiving your Shoot Key you will receive free delivery for your photo orders. PhotoLife has agreed to despatch all the orders back to the school and your child will bring their photographs home.

Any orders placed after this three week period will be sent directly to your specified delivery address and will incur a \$5.00 Postage & Packing charge. You will see this message when you go Online to view and order your photographs.

If you do not have a computer or internet access, you are welcome to collect an Order Envelope from the School Office.

CHILDRENS SAFETY IS PARAMOUNT

With the increased numbers of students, the car park is busy and the potential for an accident is greatly enhanced. To ensure everyone's safety we have implemented a few simple rules that we ask everyone to observe:

- Children are to walk their bikes/scooters to the gate where the teacher will let them go across the crossing.
- Children are not permitted to walk across the car park without an adult. Parents are asked to pick their children up from the gate (even when raining). We have had a few near misses and the risk is too great.
- Cars are asked to give way to pedestrians on the crossing.

We will continue to monitor this and will actively engage with drivers whom we consider are causing a risk. Some of our staff have had an unpleasant response at times which is disappointing. Health & Safety inside the school is our responsibility and to ensure the safety of our children the threshold for acceptable behaviour will be low. We will continue to monitor the situation. Some tips:

- If you are in the turning bay, **don't double park** as it causes a grid lock behind you from cars entering the school and exiting the car park. If you are behind someone who does this please feel free to toot, we won't mind...
- The students are told to wait until their parent parks against the curb before they get into the vehicle.

The weather is finer:

- Scooter, bike or walk to school.
- Arrive at 3.12pm less traffic, parking is easier, less stress all round.
- Smile and accept that a few minutes wait is better than a lifetime of misery because one of our children has been injured or something worse has happened.
- If your child is older, meet at the playground at the end of Hector Drive.

We have had several near miss incidents reported to us recently involving children who are not looking before crossing the road while cycling/scootering home unaccompanied.

We recommend that children under the age of 10yrs do not cycle to school unsupervised.

HEALTH CURRICULUM LEARNING

During Term 4 in your child's class we will be teaching the personal safety programme called "**Keeping Ourselves Safe**". In the Year 0-3 classes the unit is called "*Knowing What to Do*" and in the Year 4-6 classes it is titled "*Getting Help*".

Keeping Ourselves Safe has been designed to give children the skills to cope in situations involving abuse. It has three overall aims: • To develop and strengthen children's skills to

- To develop and strengthen children's skills to keep themselves safe with other people;
- To support and encourage abused children to get help from caring adults;
- To make teachers and parents more aware of the need to keep children safe from abuse by adults or other children.

The **Keeping Ourselves Safe** units will be taught by your child's teacher, with help from the local Police Education Officer as required.

To be successful, **Keeping Ourselves Safe** needs your help and support. Your child will have Home Activities to work on with you.

It is important that you participate as much as possible and talk to your child about what they have been learning. This will help reinforce the messages the school is giving, and help your child to use his or her new skills with confidence.


