MAJOR BUILDING PROJECT

We are delighted to announce that a new building project is about to begin. We will confirm start date very shortly but it will be within a week or two. This will involve the building of:

- New car park designed to ensure children don't have to cross the dangerous car park entry
- New pod of classrooms(4) between the tennis courts and Milky Way
- Two new classrooms for Hamilton North Special School between Orion/Matawhero and the car park
- In addition we expect to "add' classrooms to Earth, Ra, Orion and the new classroom block later next year

What does this mean?

The car parking work will be done mainly over the school holidays. There will be disruptions to parking and drop-off for the rest of this year, but this will be for the least amount of school time possible.

SMART WATER STARTS WITH YOU!-ALERT LEVEL 1

Everyone in Hamilton, Waikato and Waipa districts are being asked to limit the use of their sprinklers because we are going to Water Alert Level 1 today.

Water Alert Level 1 means residents can use their sprinklers only between 6-8am and 6-8pm but they can use hand-held hoses at any time. Alert Level 1 has been put in place at this early stage because the demand for water is a lot higher than what is usually expected for November even with the rainfall on Tuesday. Everyone has a part to play on conserving water now and in the future. Making small changes, such as limiting the use of your sprinkler in your garden or fixing a leaking tap, can have a positive impact on decreasing water demand. We are all in this together, so lets be smart with our water now and for future generations.
