MAJOR PROJECT- COVERED COURTS

As you would have seen from the PTA flyer that was handed out during the Meet the Teacher evening last night, the Board of Trustees and the PTA are combining their expertise in launching a major fundraising project to cover the court area beside the Ra building. This is no small task, and we will need lots of help and support so that our children can benefit from the all year round outdoor area. This is so important for physical skills as well as other outdoor learning. We see this project benefitting all our children and wider community, exciting!

From here the process is:

A combined working group from the PTA and Board and Te Totara Staff are forming to:

- Look at what the best cover should have, including options for lighting and outdoor sound system.
- Visit and see other outdoor areas in action to see what works best in a school
- We will be liaising with the Ministry of Education to gain permission for the outdoor area
- Formulate a design, with costings so we know how much is needed
- Begin fundraising, including help from the community

Timeframe

This will be part of the working groups planning, it is likely to take some time to get everything in place, but it does give us a major focus to help our children

Updates

SAFETY TO AND FROM SCHOOL

Thank you for your patience with the increased traffic flows lately, with more school age children around. The patience shown is appreciated! Next week the Principals of the three schools (Te Totara, Hamilton Christian & Rototuna Junior High) are proactively meeting with the Hamilton City Council and Police regarding this. Some points to be raised by us include:

- The crossing on Borman Road by Learning Links is a danger for pedestrians, so we are advocating a proper crossing be installed. Peak time in the morning is between 8.20am -8.40am making it almost impossible to cross without supervision
- The corner of North City Road and Borman Road is dangerous for cyclists and pedestrians, with children crossing and needs to be addressed rather quickly
- Moonlight Drive crossing near the park is a dangerous crossing

I will keep you updated on any progress in this area.

WEETBIX TRYATHLON

WHEN: Sunday 14th February, 2016

WHERE: University Fields, Hamilton East, Waikato Allow plenty of time on the morning of the event:

Make sure you allow plenty of time to get to the event venue (which is open **from 7am Sunday**, February 14th) and to find a car park. Please leave enough time to get through the numbering, check in and transition process before transition closes (at 8.15am). The more time you allow, the easier it will be. There will be lots of people and it will be very, very busy, so please be patient and listen to all instructions.

Our Te Totara Team

The purpose of entering a team is to encourage our Te Totara STARS to give it a go! We also have a chance to win great prizes and to have a school team photo taken at the end. Each child must have a parent or caregiver with them on the day. The School Gazebo is a good meeting place for parents and their child. There will be lots of people there on the day so it is essential that parents/guardians are responsible for their own child. Please note that ALL PARTICIPANTS must CHECK-IN though the bar code scanning system as they enter transition or at the Admin tent. Any child not checked in by 8.15am will not be permitted to participate.

What to take into transition checklist:

Take everything that you will need for the Weet-Bix Kids TRYathlon into the Transition Area and leave it with your bike.

- Official Weet-Bix Kids TRYathlon T-shirt with Bib Number attached to the front
- Bike with your event number sticker attached to the handle bars
- Helmet with your event number sticker attached to the front
- Running Shoes (please note that closed in shoes are compulsory for both the bike & run legs of the event)
- Socks (optional)
- Towel
- Drink bottle
- Any medication you may need use of during the Weet-Bix Kids TRYathlon (EG: Asthma puffer)

It's a good idea to have a small plastic box so that all your items are kept together and also to make your bike stand out somehow so it will be easier for you to find during the event. For example, you could use a brightly-coloured towel on your seat or handlebars.

CAR PARKING - SAFETY OF OUR CHILDREN

Thanks so much to almost everyone who takes care around the school, on behalf of our children, many thanks.

Some tips to make sure we have a safe school:

- Parking in Disabled car parks is not permitted at any time unless you have a current "Disabled Parking" permit on display in your vehicle. We have a number of families who legitimately require these carparks.
- We are noticing a few parents parking their cars on the cobblestones/footpath when picking up
 and dropping off children to and from school rather than on the driveway, particularly in front of
 the Administration Block.
 - Unfortunately, this is creating a problem with the cobblestones lifting, and the kerb cracking, so we would really appreciate your support.

Ways you can help....

- When the weather is fine, please encourage your child/ren to scooter, bike or walk to school.
- Arrive at 3.12pm less traffic, parking is easier, less stress all round.
- Smile and accept that a few minutes wait is better than a lifetime of misery because one of our children has been injured or something worse has happened.

PLEASE, NO PARKING ON YELLOW LINES, ON THE GRASS VERGE BETWEEN THE FOOTPATH AND THE ROAD OR ON/OVER ANY FOOTPATHS

We have had a visit from our local Police who advised us that the Hamilton City Council, in conjunction with the NZ Police, are actively visiting schools randomly with regard to illegal parking. They have asked us to advise our parents though the school newsletter that under **NO circumstances** is there to be any parking on yellow lines, on the grass verge between the footpath and the road or over/on the footpath. These infringements will be ticketed.

DROP-OFF & PICK-UP ZONE 8.15 am - 9.00am & 2.40 pm - 3.15 pm

Please note that the drop-off zone is for you to drive in, drop-off (or pick-up) your children and depart. We ask that you do not park and leave your car as this causes a back log of vehicles, this area is designed to keep traffic flowing. You are welcome to use the carpark beside the Matariki Hall if you wish to visit your child's classroom.

FOOD AT SCHOOL

We have children at our school who are highly allergic to dairy products and nuts and exposure to these foods could potentially be life threatening to them. We have procedures in place for 1:1 support for these children to ensure their safety. At present we will continue to carry on with our normal food eating programme, but we have to carefully plan school events/learning area celebrations etc. With this in mind, please don't be offended if any kind offers of food to the school are scrutinised. Please ensure all food containers are clearly named. We are also looking at the bringing of food to school for birthdays for the class as cakes etc may not be a healthy option due to allergies.

VISITORS TO OUR SCHOOL (INCLUDING PARENTS)

If you are visiting our school for business reasons, or as a parent dropping off things to your child during school hours, please report to the School Office before entering the school grounds. In the event of an Emergency situation, we will know who is onsite at any given time.

Can you please ensure that all school uniforms are clearly named and that your family has the correct clothing. We have our Yellow Lost & Found property box down outside our purple block Earth for Parents and Children to view daily.



SWIMMING CLASS LESSONS 2016

We are very lucky to be able to continue our school swimming programme in 2016. This is a vital part of our Te Totara Health and Physical Education curriculum. Our school pool is in fabulous condition with a new heat pump programmed for 30 degrees. We will be operating our 'in school' swimming programme from February to May and September to December each year. Our children will continue to learn from qualified instructors with a programme which includes aqua education, survival skills and swimming stroke work. Lessons will be held with small numbers of children in the classes which research shows is 'best practise' learning, your child will receive a block course of 2 weeks of swimming lessons for a very reasonable fee of \$60 per year. The fee will go towards employing our qualified swim instructors and the ongoing costs of keeping our school pool running. These costs are also subsidised by our curriculum budgets to ensure they are affordable for all. These fees can be paid over the year in instalments by automatic payment if you would like to. The students swimming progress will be monitored and you will receive a certificate of your child's ongoing progress and achievements. SWIM SCHOOL LESSONS AFTER SCHOOL AT TE TOTARA, LIMITED SPACES LEFT

We have had a great response to our Swim School lessons which will start next week after school on Tuesday's and Wednesday's. Sorry to everyone who has missed out this time, I do have your contact details and I will keep in touch with other swim school offers.

These are additional to your child's in school class lessons and a great way to boost your child's confidence in the water. **Get in quick**, we have 3 spaces left, Tuesday 5.30pm for level 4+ swimmer and Wednesday 5.30pm for a level 2 swimmer.

This would be a 7-week block course, starting Tuesday 16th February 2016.

Fees are \$101.50 per child to be paid at the School Office and lessons are 25 minutes each week.

Parents are reminded please to stay on site for your child's swim school lesson as per our swim School terms and conditions.

If your child/ren attends our ASC, arrangements can be made for your child to attend these lessons. A copy of our terms and conditions is available on our school website or from our School Office.

We will also be offering a one week block course of swimming lessons in the April school holidays, <u>Week 1</u>, 18-22 April 2016, Fees \$75 or <u>Week 2</u>, 26-29 April 2016, Fees \$60. (This is a 4 day week) Get in quick as spaces are limited for these block courses.
