CAR PARKING - SAFETY AT OUR SCHOOL

Please, <u>NO</u> parking on the grass at the front of our school. This is very dangerous for children and drivers whilst coming and leaving school. Signs are now in place to confirm **NO** parking areas.

SCHOOL UNIFORMS - EMBROIDME

We have just found out that the local Hamilton store of EmbroidMe that supplies Te Totara uniforms, has gone into liquidation. The nature of liquidation means that it is foist upon the business suddenly so there is often no warning to customers and suppliers. This means Te Totara currently has no supplier of our school uniform. The school is moving as quick as we can to support our community at this time.

Some FAQS:

If I have a current uniform, will it become useless?

No, the current uniform will stay and one criteria for a new supplier is to continue the current style of uniform as close as possible to the existing school uniform.

My child doesn't have correct uniform, what do I do? Don't worry, send them to school with as close as possible to the existing uniform, we will not be worried about that. The main thing is that they have a smile and enjoy school.

What happens to future uniforms?

We will now go out in the market with a request for a proposal to supply uniforms to the school. This will be a competitive tender to get the best arrangement for all. We will update you on further developments in this area.

SANITARIUM WEET-BIX KIDS TRYATHLON

This year's Weet-Bix TRYathlon will be held on **Sunday 17th February 2013 at the University Fields**, Hamilton East. We are excited to be entering a school team of 61 participants! We will have our school gazebo set up on the day as a meeting point for students and their families and will aim to set this up as close to the finish line as possible.

A few important things:

* Please visit the <u>http://tryathlon.weetbix.co.nz</u> to download the Race Preparation Checklist and a map of the event.

* Make sure you allow plenty of time to get to the event (which is open from 7am on the day) and to find a car park

* Once you arrive you will need to get through the numbering, check in your child, and talk through the transition process with your child before the transition closes (8:15 am on the day of the event).

* If you are going to receive your event kit through the school you need to head to the Numbering Flags to have your bib number written on your arms and legs by HELP TEAM volunteers in red T shirts. You must have your bike, bib number label sheet and T shirt with you. Then you and your child need to head towards Transition where the "Check-In: Flags are to be quickly scanned in and receive your Arena Swim Cap. Remember, you must bring your bib number label sheet with bar code for scanning and t-shirt with you from your official Event Kit. Once you have checked in you will keep moving to rack your bike (with one parent/caregiver to help their child). See the Weet-bix website for the Transition checklist.

* At approximately 12:30 pm the Weet-Bix Kids TRYathlon concludes and prizegiving begins. You must be present at prizegiving with your event number to claim any prizes. The TRANSITION area will open at the conclusion of prizegiving. You should plan to be at the University Fields until approximately 1pm.

* We will have a Te Totara Weet-Bix TRYathlon Team photo taken after the event.

* Approximate distances for event:

7 year olds - 50m swim, 4km cycle, 1.5km run

8-10 year olds - 100m swim, 4km cycle, 1.5km run

It is a good idea to practise these distances a few times before the event, and especially practise the transitions from swimming to cycling to running. Another great suggestion is to have a flag or scarf to mark your child's bike so that they can more easily locate their bike after their swim.
