UNIFORM UPDATE

You are now probably aware that the school uniform supplier, EmbroidMe has gone into liquidation, not a nice thing to happen for all. Fortunately, the Liquidator has been helpful with those who have pre-ordered, but if families have any difficulties please contact me, I am happy to advocate for families affected.

What is happening now?

We are finalising a list of criteria for a request for proposal to go out to suppliers, among things we are considering are:

- Static display at school for sizing purposes
- On-line ordering system to make it easy for parents to purchase
- Quality garments that last
- A continuation of the current uniform theme, so that families can still use existing garments

We will get this out shortly and I will keep you updated on progress, especially the timeframes. Meanwhile, please don't fret over the uniform - just send your child to school in appropriate school clothing.

NOVOPAY

This is the pay system provided by the Ministry of Education along with Talent2 for school staff. In the media you may have seen information on this and perhaps wondered what the effect is on Te Totara.

We have indeed have had some interesting challenges with the system, with staff being underpaid, overpaid and information not being processed.

This has resulted in considerable time spent on trying to ensure that everyone gets paid the right amount and on time. My thanks go to Wendy Bulloch, our School Executive Officer, who has worked above and beyond to help everyone.

Our school staff have been amazingly patient and have continued to focus on the children, to them my sincere thanks!

Our school Board of Trustees have been fantastic and in every case of underpayment, we have ensured that our staff have been paid by the school and we will seek reimbursement from the Ministry of Education.

We will continue to ensure that our people are looked after; it is likely that there will be more challenges regarding this in the future.

SHARING OUR LEARNING

With the arrival of iPads in our school our teachers are keen to use this technology to share our students' learning with the community. SCHOOL DONATION

MATHLETICS, TO HELP LEARNING

As this programme has been so successful in previous years, we are excited to be able to provide you with a subscription to Mathletics for <u>\$20</u> <u>per child</u> for a year (usually a one-year subscription costs \$99 per child). Subscribing to Mathletics will entitle students to 24-hour web access both at home and in school.

Teachers are encouraging their students with this programme as it helps with important maths skills; you will also find teachers using it in their daily maths programmes.

A few important things:

* Please visit the <u>http://tryathlon.weetbix.co.nz</u> to download the Race Preparation Checklist and a map of the event.

* Make sure you allow plenty of time to get to the event (which is open from 7am on the day) and to find a car park

* Once you arrive you will need to get through the numbering, check in your child, and talk through the transition process with your child before the transition closes (8:15 am on the day of the event).

* If you are going to receive your event kit through the school you need to head to the Numbering Flags to have your bib number written on your arms and legs by HELP TEAM volunteers in red T shirts. You must have your bike, bib number label sheet and T shirt with you. Then you and your child need to head towards Transition where the "Check-In: Flags are to be quickly scanned in and receive your Arena Swim Cap. Remember, you must bring your bib number label sheet with bar code for scanning and t-shirt with you from your official Event Kit. Once you have checked in you will keep moving to rack your bike (with one parent/caregiver to help their child). See the Weet-bix website for the Transition checklist.

* At approximately 12:30 pm the Weet-Bix Kids TRYathlon concludes and prize giving begins. You must be present at prize giving with your event number to claim any prizes. The TRANSITION area will open at the conclusion of prize giving. You should plan to be at the University Fields until approximately 1pm.

* We will have a Te Totara Weet-Bix TRYathlon Team photo taken after the event.

* Approximate distances for event:

7 year olds - 50m swim, 4km cycle, 1.5km run

8-10 year olds - 100m swim, 4km cycle, 1.5km run
