NAMING OF SCHOOL UNIFORM & SCOOTERS

SCHOOL DONATION

HEADLICE

A product has been recommended to Our School called "**NitEnz**" which is a natural shampoo proven to be very effective in eradicating headlice. It can be purchased from the supermarket.

We have also been advised by local Public Health Nurse that another alternative method of treating head lice is to apply a large amount of conditioner (cheaper brands are OK) to the hair and use a head lice comb to comb them out. You will need to repeat this procedure every 3 days for a total 3 weeks to break the head lice cycle.

We suggest to all our families to check your child/ren's hair on a weekly basis and wash hats regularly.
