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CHARTER AND ANNUAL PLAN

Today we are sending home a pamphlet outlining our Strategic and Annual targets with the oldest or only student in the school. You can also find these on our School website under the 2017 Charter Section, along with the 2017-2019 Strategic and 2017 Annual Plan, 2017 Targets and the 2016 Analysis of Variance.

Some information:

- The Strategic Plan is our three-year plan (on one page) to support our vision of Growing and Learning Together
- Our Annual Plan and targets are based on achievement results from 2016 and Ministry of Education priorities. It sets out very specific actions, responsibilities, resourcing and timeframes to achieve our targets
- Our goals are set above the Government expectations of 85% of students achieving at or above National Standards in Reading, Writing and Maths.

How did we get on in 2016? - Significant Points

- There were significant gains in Maths during 2016, reflecting our three year professional learning programme. This saw 98.8% of students who had been at our school for one year or more achieve the National Standard or above
- In Reading for all students 86% of students achieved the National Standard or above
- In Writing for all students 90% of students achieved the National Standard or above
- In Maths for all students 93% of students achieved the National Standard or above
- Our school is a very diverse school, we now have 19% (144 students) of our students who qualify for English as Second Language Resourcing. We do know that over time these wonderful students achieve well
- We have a focus on lifting achievement in a number of areas including Year 2 in reading. This is an area that a number of children are building their English Language experiences to support their reading.

Our Targets for 2017 Background

Our targets are set from achievement data and school and MOE priorities. All targets are set against students who have been at Te Totara Primary School for one year or more at the end of 2017 (using Ministry of Education data collected at the end of 2016 as a base figure).

Reading

After 2 Years at school (Total -87)	85% (74 students)at or above in relation to National Standards

Writing

Students	Target
All students (Total - 713)	90% (642 students)at or above in relation to National Standards
Maori students (Total - 76)	90% (69 students)at or above in relation to National Standards
Pasifika students (Total - 18)	90% (16 students)at or above in relation to National Standards
Year 5 students (Total - 131)	90% (118 students)at or above in relation to National Standards

Maths

Students	Target
All students (Total - 713)	92% (656 students)at or above in relation to National Standards
Maori students (Total - 76)	92% (70 students)at or above in relation to National Standards
Pasifika students (Total - 18)	85% (15 students)at or above in relation to National Standards
Year 6 (Total - 112)	91% (102 students)at or above in relation to National Standards

The Board will look at the number of enrolments, the level of projected student growth and determine how many spaces for out-of-zone students are available for the upcoming enrolment period of **1st July 2017 - 15th December 2017**. This will be completed in late May, allowing for lots of time for families to know what is happening.
