We are now into our fourth week of the school year and it has been a busy but settled start to the school year. Our oldest students have had a wonderful camp experience and we are noticing how well routines are being established to support learning across the school.

This newsletter details a recent change due to National Standards being abolished as well as possible future system changes. I do hope you take the time to read through these as we move forward.

NATIONAL STANDARDS GONE

At the very end of last year National Standards were abolished, these had been in place since 2010. Understandably, this has led to questions about this and what schools would or could do. We wanted to give our community some surety about what our school is doing as a result of these changes.

What do Schools have to do?

The requirements for schools are published in the National Administration Guidelines (NAGS) which state schools are obliged to comply with, these were updated on 14th December, 2017. You can find these here.. <u>NAGS</u>. These set out clearly the requirements for schools.

A quick summary of key points of the NAGS for families:

- Schools have to provide the New Zealand Curriculum, which you can find here....NZ Curriculum
- Give priority to student progress and achievement in Literacy and Numeracy especially in Years 1–8
- Report twice a year to parents across the curriculum, including Literacy and Numeracy

What will we do?

- Continue the programmes, processes and systems already in place, which have always been based on the curriculum. We know these support progress and achievement. Essentially it is business as usual.
- We will report to parents against the curriculum as we have always done, this will include reporting in Literacy and Numeracy and where children are in relation to the curriculum expectations and where to next.
- Next week we will be sending out information on goal setting with children, teachers and family for the Learning plan discussions on 21 & 22 March, to support our vision of "Growing and Learning Together"

CHANGES IN EDUCATION
