#### **ONLINE TIPS FOR PARENTS**

In this age of increased use of technology, it is timely to look at some possible support for parents and children. Netsafe is an organisation supported by the Ministry of Education and the NZ Police which is very helpful in providing ideas and help. I have included the link to 10 tips for parents. It provides useful guidelines to help...10 tips for parents

An area that is useful to clarify is the sign-up age for social media accounts. For Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, Twitter and Youtube it is 13 years of age. Netsafe provide some good advice below for parents in this area...

How old should kids be before they get social media accounts? The minimum sign up age for Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, Twitter and YouTube is 13 years of age. Of course, if they're under the age minimum it's always better that they're honest with you about using an app or site, rather than doing it behind your back. This way, you can help them to stay safe online.

#### Tips for setting up social media accounts

#### Make sure you've taught them the online safety basics

- 1. Help your child to set up the account
- 2. Depending on their age, use your email address to sign up
- 3. Enter their actual birth year so they're less likely to see inappropriate content
- 4. Become their friend, or follow them
- 5. Teach them about the safety tools available

This online system allows you to pay for our school's fees (Mathletics, Aquatics, School Donation) and is also the <u>ONLY</u> way to register your child for sports.
