Students will need to look their best, so please ensure that ONLY our correct school uniform is worn and that it is in a <u>clean and tidy</u>

condition (black school shorts/skort, white polo shirt and red polar fleece).

Soon after Photo Day your son or daughter will bring home an online slip with their unique Shoot Key detailed on it. When you log-in your personalised Shoot Key number will display all the photographs of your child <u>including an individual photo</u> (and sibling photo if you have ordered one).

It is then an easy process for you to shop online and purchase the photographs you want. If you place your order within three weeks of receiving your Shoot Key you will receive free delivery of your order to the school.

If you order after the 3 week free delivery period, a postage & handling fee per order will apply and orders will be sent to your home.

For families who do not wish to use the Photolife online system, order envelopes will be available from the School Office soon after Photo Day.

A Photolife flyer will go home today to the eldest child in each family.

If you wish to have a sibling photograph, please collect a "Sibling Photo Request Form" from the School Office and return it <u>BEFORE</u> Photo Day to the School Office. Sibling Photos will be delivered to the school along with the Class and Individual photos at a later date.



ILLNESS AT SCHOOL

SCHOOL CROSS COUNTRY - TUESDAY 14TH AUGUST, 2018

Once again it is that time of year when our children are training hard for our School Cross-Country. This is to be held on **Tuesday 14th August, 2018 (Week 4, Term 3)**. Running is a fantastic sport to be involved in at any age. It brings many rewarding benefits, including the obvious physical, mental and personal development. It teaches children goal setting and helps build perseverance and resilience. **Regular**



physical exercise has also been shown to increase general well-being and reduce anxiety. Our students are currently working on increasing their fitness with circuit training and various fun endurance games and activities where their heart rate is elevated for extended periods

CONGRATULATIONS TO WENDY BULLOCH

In Wendy's role as Executive Officer for Te Totara Primary School she belongs to a national body of School Executive Officers/Business Managers. The name of this Association is the School Business Managers Association (previously School Executive Officers Association) and caters for those in the role in High Schools, Intermediate Schools and Primary Schools across New Zealand. The main aim of the Association is to offer Professional Development and support for School Business Managers.



The National Executive Committee of the Association are all volunteers and are comprised of Regional Delegates for 9 regions in New Zealand from

Southland to Northland. As well as the Regional Delegates there is a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer who comprise the Officers of the Association.

Wendy was voted last year to be the Waikato Regional Delegate of the Association. Her main task was to organise professional development days once a term for the Waikato members. Workshops were arranged covering accounting and reporting requirements for school finances, property management, personnel issues, health and safety, and the list goes on.

They also have representation at Ministry of Education initiatives and last year Wendy attended meetings on a proposed Student Information Sharing Initiative which could see important data for each learner following them automatically from Early Childhood to Tertiary Education.

At their last AGM on 19th July, 2018 Wendy was voted as the **Secretary of the Association**. It is testament to Wendy's ability that her peers had confidence in her to represent them at this level. Her first task is to update the School Business Managers website making it a "one stop shop" with resources and links to valuable information for not only the Business Managers, but also the Senior Leadership teams in schools.

LATE COLLECTION OF CHILDREN AFTER SCHOOL - SCHOOL FINISHES AT 3.00PM

We have noticed an increased trend in children being picked up late after school. We understand that some children may be waiting for an older sibling from RJHS to collect them, or perhaps one of their siblings may be involved in after school sports at Te Totara.

However, **school finishes at** <u>3.00pm</u> and we would expect that our children have either been collected or have **left the school premises by 3.15pm**. After this time our staff are involved in meetings and are unable to supervise any remaining children. If children remain at school after 3.15pm, it is the parents/caregivers responsibility for the safety and supervision your child/ren.

Special Rate: If your child is waiting for their sibling from RJHS to collect them, **After School Care (ASC)** facilities are available at our school at a rate of \$6.00 an hour per child (minimum charge of hour) instead of the casual fee which is \$8.00 per hour. This will provide a safe environment for your child and peace of mind for you as a parent/caregiver as they wait for their sibling. Please follow the process below to register your Te Totara child/ren for ASC.

Once you have registered, please email <u>afterschoolcare@tetotara.school.nz</u> and let them know that you are one of the families who requires ASC for a short period of time while your child is waiting to be collected by an older sibling attending RJHS, this is so your booking fee can be adjusted accordingly.

Here's what you need to do to enrol at ASC:

- 1. Go to our school website www.tetotara.school.nz and click red quicklink "Before and After School Care" then click on the "Enrol Now 2018" button.
- 2. Once you reach the Registration page, click the purple "register now" button.
- 3. Follow the registration process and enrol your child/ren
- 4. After this has been done, click the dashboard in the Menu Bar at the top of the screen, now you can make a booking :)
- 5. Click on the "make a booking" button and complete the booking into the desired programme
- 6. Once completed, your booking is now pending and will be confirmed via a confirmation email.
