#### To support Daffodil Day, our children can come to school with crazy hair *(if they wish)* and wearing something yellow *(mufti clothing)*.

## **OUT-OF-ZONE ENROLMENTS FOR 2019**

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available on our school website <u>www.tetotara.school.nz</u>

The Board has determined that <u>15 places for New Entrant (Year 1) students</u> are likely to be available to out-of-zone students for the enrolment period of **15th December 2018 – 30th June 2019**. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

There will be two 2019 out-of-zone enrolment periods: The First enrolment period runs from 15th December 2018 – 30th June 2019 The Second enrolment period runs from 1<sup>st</sup> July 2019 – 19th December 2019

For students seeking enrolment within the first enrolment period of **15th December 2018 - 30th June 2019**, the deadline for receipt of out-of-zone applications is **3.00pm on Friday 28th September**, **2018** and should be addressed to:

Te Totara Primary School PO Box 28134 Hamilton 3256

Parents of students who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year. Students who live in the home zone are entitled to enrol at the school.

Applications from out-of-zone students will be processed in the following order of priority:

- a) **First Priority** must be given to students who have been accepted for enrolment in a special programme(s) run by the school and approved by the Secretary of Education\*.
  - \* This priority is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Ministry of Education
- b) **Second Priority** must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a current student of the school.
- c) Third Priority must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a former student of the school.
- d) Fourth Priority must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- e) **Fifth Priority** must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the Board of the school, or a child of a member of the Board of the school.
- f) Sixth Priority must be given to all other applicants.

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot supervised by a Justice of the Peace, a Practicing Lawyer or a Police Officer in accordance under Section 11G (1) of the Education Act 1989.

If a ballot for out-of-zone is required, it will be held on <u>Friday 12th October, 2018</u>. Parents will be informed of the outcome by **Wednesday 17th October, 2018**.

**TICKETS:** We ask families to please be mindful that there are many Year 3, 4, 5 & 6 families wanting to attend an evening performance therefore, we have to limit ticket sales to a **maximum** of 2 tickets per family for the 7.00pm performance. There may be extra tickets available to purchase closer to the event, we will let you know. Thank you in advance. *PLEASE NOTE: There is no ticket limit for the 1.30pm Matinee performances.* 

### **ALL TICKETS ARE \$10.00 EACH** Children 3 years old and under are FREE, provided they are sitting on the knee of a paying adult ticket. Otherwise, you <u>must</u> purchase a separate ticket for them.



Limited to 300 tickets each performance. Sorry, <u>NO</u> door sales on the night.

- Payment of tickets is through KINDO. Sorry, we will not be accepting any payments through internet banking or through the School Office.
- If you do not have access to a computer, you are welcome to use the school iPad which is available in the School Office. If you do not have an email address, please contact Marise Crow 07 853-0039 ext. 858.
- Tickets are non-refundable nor transferable so please ensure you are ordering the correct day/time.
- We acknowledge that some families may have children performing on both days and may have to purchase tickets for each of the days. Unfortunately, we cannot offer any solution to this as the money from ticket sales goes towards the costumes, lighting, sound, backdrops etc.
- Only 300 tickets are available for each performance so don't miss out!. NO extra seating or standing room will be allowed due to Health & Safety Regulations.
- The School Office will regularly check sales through KINDO and will send colour coded ticket/s home with the oldest child in each family within a few days of purchase: Wednesday 26th September Milky Way & Earth Teams (1.30pm/Pink ticket and 7.00pm/Blue ticket) Thursday 27th September Marama & Ra Teams (1.30pm/Yellow ticket and 7.00pm/Orange ticket)
- Please remember to bring your ticket to the performance; this will confirm you have purchased a seat. <u>Sorry, no ticket/no entry</u> there will be <u>NO DOOR SALES.</u>
- Doors open for Matinee Performances at 1.00pm / Evening Performances doors open at 6.30pm
- The number on your ticket is NOT your seat number, seating is on a first-come-first-served basis.
- There will be an area allocated for wheelchair access and seating. If you require this service, please make sure you indicate this when purchasing your tickets through KINDO.
- <u>All Year 3, 4, 5 & 6 students</u> are required to attend each of their own team performances. Students performing on the day/evening do not require a ticket.
- All our students will have an opportunity to see a dress rehearsal of the Senior School Production during school time.
