- Payment of tickets is through KINDO. Sorry, we will not be accepting any payments through internet banking or through the School Office.
- If you do not have access to a computer, you are welcome to use the school iPad which is available in the School Office. If you do not have an email address, please contact Marise Crow 07 853-0039 ext. 858.
- Tickets are non-refundable nor transferable so please ensure you are ordering the correct day/time.
- We acknowledge that some families may have children performing on both days and may have to purchase tickets for each of the days. Unfortunately, we cannot offer any solution to this as the money from ticket sales goes towards the costumes, lighting, sound, backdrops etc.
- Only 300 tickets are available for each performance so don't miss out!. NO extra seating or standing room will be allowed due to Health & Safety Regulations.
- The School Office will regularly check sales through KINDO and will send colour coded ticket/s home with the oldest child in each family within a few days of purchase: Wednesday 26th September Milky Way & Earth Teams (1.30pm/Pink ticket and 7.00pm/Blue ticket) Thursday 27th September Marama & Ra Teams (1.30pm/Yellow ticket and 7.00pm/Orange ticket)
- Please remember to bring your ticket to the performance; this will confirm you have purchased a seat. <u>Sorry, no ticket/no entry</u> there will be <u>NO DOOR SALES</u>.
- Doors open for Matinee Performances at 1.00pm / Evening Performances doors open at 6.30pm
- The number on your ticket is NOT your seat number, seating is on a first-come-first-served basis.

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- There will be an area allocated for wheelchair access and seating. If you require this service, please make sure you indicate this when purchasing your tickets through KINDO.
- <u>All Year 3, 4, 5 & 6 students</u> are required to attend each of their own team performances. Students performing on the day/evening do not require a ticket.
- For evening performances the Lead Characters are required to meet in the Staffroom at 6.00pm.
- All other evening performance students are to arrive at 6.30pm and go directly to their allocated classrooms where they will be supervised.
- All our students will have an opportunity to watch a dress rehearsal of the Senior School Production during school time.

On Tuesday, four teachers took a group of nearly 90 students to the Year 5 & 6 Cluster Winter Sports Tournament held at Southwell to play Football, Hockey, Netball and Rippa Rugby.

We were very privileged to have coaches, managers and supporters join us on the day, and would like to especially thank the coaches who made themselves available to support their team on tournament day, as they have all season.

We participated alongside Endeavour, Insoll, Rototuna, Southwell, Hukanui, St Josephs, Woodstock, Bankwood and Fairfield Primary Schools.

All the teachers were impressed with the fair play, sportsmanship, respectfulness, and effort the students put into their matches, and were very proud of the Te Totara group.

Our best result was our Shooters Year 5 Netball Team who had a very exciting final to Endeavour, with a loss 6-3.

#### PLEASE NOTE:

#### **STREP THROAT**

We have a few students away with Strep Throat at present. According to the Ministry of Health Infectious Diseases Guidelines:

- Early signs are a headache, vomiting and a sore throat (coughing, sneezing etc)
- The child is infectious 24-48 hours if treated with antibiotics
- Time between exposure and sickness is 1-3 days
- This disease is spread by contact with the secretions of a strep sore throat
- Exclusion from school is 24 Hours after antibiotics have been started

If you are unsure whether your child should return to school, please see to your family doctor.

## **OUT-OF-ZONE ENROLMENTS FOR 2019**

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available on our school website <u>www.tetotara.school.nz</u>

The Board has determined that <u>15 places for New Entrant (Year 1) students</u> are likely to be available to out-of-zone students for the enrolment period of **15th December 2018 – 30th June 2019**. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

There will be two 2019 out-of-zone enrolment periods:

The First enrolment period runs from 15th December 2018 – 30th June 2019

The Second enrolment period runs from 1<sup>st</sup> July 2019 – 19th December 2019

For students seeking enrolment within the first enrolment period of **15th December 2018 - 30th June 2019**, the deadline for receipt of out-of-zone applications is **3.00pm on Friday 28th September**,

2018 and should be addressed to: Te Totara Primary School, PO Box 28134, Hamilton 3256

Parents of students who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year. Students who live in the home zone are entitled to enrol at the school.

Please view previous school newsletters for the order of priority for out-of-zone applications.

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot supervised by a Justice of the Peace, a Practicing Lawyer or a Police Officer in accordance under Section 11G (1) of the Education Act 1989.

If a ballot for out-of-zone is required, it will be held on **Friday 12th October**, **2018**. Parents will be informed of the outcome by **Wednesday 17th October**, **2018**.
