** URGENT ** - SIBLING OUT-OF-ZONE ENROLMENTS FOR 2019 Enrolment Period of 1st June 2019 - 19th December, 2019

The Board of Trustees are looking to accommodate, if possible, younger siblings and children of staff in the 2019 school year. To help determine this, we urgently need to have Out-of-zone Enrolment Forms into the School Office to help with this process. Please complete our standard Enrolment Form for each child, which is available online from our school website <u>www.tetotara.school.nz</u> or by visiting the School Office.

The Board will look at the number of enrolments, the level of projected student growth and determine how many spaces for out-of-zone students are available for the upcoming enrolment period of **1st June 2019 - 19th December**, **2019**. This will be completed in late May, allowing for lots of time for families to know what is happening. Further information around the number of out-of-zone spaces to be released will be communicated via the school newsletter over the next few weeks.

Netsafe release regarding the Momo Challenge https://www.netsafe.org.nz/momo-challenge-advisory-february-2019

Netsafe has received reports relating to young people who have been exposed to a harmful online "game" known as the Momo Challenge. Although we have not received any reports of young people in New Zealand taking part in the "challenge", we are aware that some young people have seen content relating to Momo and have been very upset by the content and imagery. There has also been talk about whether this "challenge" is real or a hoax. Regardless of whether the actual challenge itself exists, individuals who come



across Momo related content may experience emotional distress at seeing it – particularly younger children.

Netsafe encourages anyone that comes across content relating to the Momo Challenge or other similar 'challenge' content to immediately report it to the social media site or website that it's on. In New Zealand, it is against the law to incite another person to take their own life. If somebody is targeting a young person to play this "game", or attempting to incite suicide, you should contact the Police and Netsafe for help, and a mental health service for support. Netsafe can also provide advice for any parents who are concerned about this challenge. If young people are expressing feelings about self-harm or suicide then this should be followed up with appropriate mental health support.

Netsafe's advice for parents about exposure to upsetting content:

- Have a conversation with young people about what to do if they do come across upsetting content online
- Let your child know that they can come to you when they find something upsetting and they won't get in trouble
- Stay calm if they do come to you don't assign blame, reassure them that it's not their fault and don't punish them for seeking help
- Normalise their feelings let them know that it is normal to feel scared, confused or upset
- Don't over-react by taking away the technology this may make them less likely to talk to you if something else happens
- For young children in particular, consider using parental controls to block out specific keywords like "Momo"
- If you or your child comes across this type of content report it to the platform that it's on
- If your child is expressing any concerning feelings, follow up with mental health support
- If you know that a young person has been engaging in this challenge, report it to the Police and Netsafe, and contact a mental health service for support.

Perhaps the best general <u>advice</u> is for parents to address such issues pre-emptively, not necessarily dwelling on any specific rumours but advising their children to be responsible and let them know if they encounter anything in the digital realm that appears frightening or threatening:

"Pre-emptively addressing something with your kid is always better," said Dr. Meghan Walls, a paediatric psychologist.

She says it might be a good idea to gently ask your younger kids if they know about this. "Something like, You know, there's some scary things that pop up on phones and tablets and if you ever see something like that, come get me.""

And for your older kids? Maybe get them to promise they'll talk to you about the Momo Challenge if it's sent to them. It's not realistic to simply take their phone away, but let them know this is cyberbullying, it's potentially dangerous, and that you're trusting them to let you know what's going on.

"Especially as kids get older and they are teenagers, they want some of that autonomy, and they deserve it as long as they can show you they're responsible enough," Walls said.

An exciting new development in Rototuna is one step closer to taking shape.

The Council is inviting people to have their say on the new Rototuna village being developed in the fast-growing north-eastern suburbs of Hamilton.

"Following the Council decision last year to set aside funds for the development of community facilities in Rototuna, the project has been moving forward at a rapid pace. There has been a huge amount of work undertaken in guite a short space of time - and now the community is able to have their say," said Natasha Ryan, project manager for Rototuna.

The Council set aside \$19.6M in 2018 for the development of community facilities in Rototuna. The community facilities agreed were:

- a community centre and library, with bookable rooms and meeting places
- a village square
- carparks

Both proposals feature space for a potential pool/fitness centre which would need to be developed in partnership with a commercial operator.

While recognising there have been high community expectations an aquatic centre would be built in Rototuna, the Council is being clear at the outset of this engagement process, a potential pool is only viable if a commercial operator can be attracted to invest.

Initial engagement with people of the north-eastern suburbs early-on, expressed their desire for "a welcoming community village with flexible, inviting, connected and usable spaces".


"We are presenting two proposals to start a conversation, each with different strengths and weaknesses. It's very important that the people of Rototuna have their say, so we have a better understanding of their needs, and how we can best design the village to strengthen the community within the parameters we have," Ms Ryan said.

"The Council has no preferred proposal – we genuinely want the people of Rototuna to talk to us about what they like about the proposals."

The area for the village development is on North City Rd, to the north of Borman Rd.

Two proposals have been developed to offer the growing community the opportunity to develop a unique and special place
