NEW ZEALAND IS HAVING A GENERAL ELECTION ON OCTOBER 17. ONLY ADULTS OVER 18 YEARS OLD CAN VOTE, BUT IT'S GOOD FOR YOU KIDS TO KNOW WHAT'S GOING ON AND WHAT ALL THE FUSS IS ABOUT!

### WHAT'S AN ELECTION?

An election is held every three years and it's when New Zealanders get to vote for who they want to be in charge of our country. The people who work in these jobs are called politicians. If the politicians get enough votes, they get a seat in parliament. There's only 120 seats, and WAY more than 120 people that want a seat. If they get a seat, then they get to vote for laws and help to run our country.

### WHAT IS A PARLIAMENT?

The parliament makes the laws. The New Zealand parliament is made up of the 120 people who win the seats. There are also things called parties – these are groups that politicians are members of – the party that gets the most votes in an election is in charge. A party or group of parties working together, must get over half the seats in parliament so that when they vote, they will always get more than half the votes needed to pass a law. There are FIVE parties currently represented in our parliament. They are Labour, National, NZ First, The Green Party and ACT.

### **OUR VOTING SYSTEM - MMP**

Mixed Member Proportional (MMP) is the voting system we use to elect our Parliament. NZ is divided into 72 local areas called electorates. Each electorate chooses one MP to represent them in Parliament, called an Electorate MP. The other 49 MPs are elected from political party lists and are called List MPs. Every voter gets to vote for ONE political party that they support and gets ONE electorate vote.

## WHAT HAPPENS ON VOTING DAY?

Voters make their way to a local school, church or building that has been made into a voting station. They take turns going into a private booth to cast their vote. They tick their choices on the paper form and drop it into a ballot box. The ballot boxes are collected up throughout the day and counted. Late at night on voting day, the results start to come through and a Parliament is chosen!

Over 25 thousand people are needed to make an election happen! There are people to make sure the election runs smoothly, people to make sure that everyone is enrolled to vote and knows about it Plus, there's a team of people to count all the votes!




