It is wonderful to be back on our school site as a family of learners again. A very warm welcome to you all, it is fantastic to have so many new families joining us this year. I hope you all had a great holiday and feel rested and refreshed for the year ahead. The summer weather was certainly fabulous and these early days at school remain hot and sunny. Further on in this newsletter we have information regarding our 'Hot Day Protocol.'

During the holidays our staff have been busy preparing for the school year ahead. Our cleaners have completed a thorough clean of all areas, everything is sparkling and hygienic. Ian and John our Caretakers have also been busy ensuring all buildings, playing areas and our grounds are well maintained and safe. There are some building projects underway at the moment. On our Covered Court the turf is being replaced so during the holidays the groundworks were completed, however the new turf is arriving from overseas, so we are affected by a delay at the ports. We have been assured that the turf replacement will be completed by the end of February. Until then that area is closed. We are also preparing for some additional roll growth learning areas to be built during Term 1, so it is a busy time on the property front.

Te Totara Primary remains very alert in terms of the global events regarding Covid 19, I wish to assure you all that we are very careful with high standards of hygiene and safety practises in all areas. Just as we did in 2020, I will communicate with you if anything occurs that the community needs to know about or respond to. Please be assured that we are organised and 'nimble' with our responses to any changing circumstances, the needs of our children and families are at the forefront of any decisions we make.

The Ministry of Education have sent us the following information to share with you all:

New Zealand remains at Alert level 1 and everyone is doing the right thing to prevent the spread of COVID-19, so we're pleased to say it's business as usual.

With over 100,000 people coming back to New Zealand through managed isolation facilities, our very low number of community cases is a reflection of the quality of work by the managed isolation staff and health authorities. Overall, 1.5 million people have now been tested.

Unfortunately, we have to expect COVID cases to emerge but we can be reassured by the speed, breadth and depth of the health response. As noted by Minister Hipkins, New Zealand is top equal with Australia in the world as having the highest rates of testing per positive case. We know that the approaches being taken in the MIQ are at a very tight forensic level.

According to the <u>Lowy Institute</u>, New Zealand has been ranked the best at responding to the COVID-19 outbreak out of nearly 100 countries.

We continue to have a large amount of control over how we can prevent the spread of COVID. For our school we will:

- display QR code posters for the NZ COVID Tracer App
- keep our visitor register, attendance register and timetables up to date
- be monitoring for illness and asking anyone who is unwell to remain at home, or to go home

- encourage people with relevant symptoms to seek medical advice through Healthline or their GP and get tested for COVID if recommended to do so
- reinforce the importance of good hand washing and drying
- reinforce good cough and sneeze etiquette

By adhering to the above measures we are keeping everyone safe and will be able to continue functioning in a 'normal manner.' We have many exciting events planned for this year which we look forward to sharing with you.

SAFETY IN AND AROUND OUR SCHOOL - PLEASE COMPLY WITH THESE GUIDELINES

With the return of lots of excited children and new families to our school we need to reinforce some important "Te Totara Guidelines and Rules to you all.

- Please cross Hector Drive by **using the pedestrian crossing with the lights**. It is not safe nor modelling good practise to cross to the other side of the road in front of the school as there are multiple ways cars are moving in this area. The staff on duty at the end of the day will be directing the students to the pedestrian crossing. If you park on the other side of the road please use the crossing to go across the street.
- Some good areas to park are on some of the surrounding streets slightly away from the school. We have easy access to many of these streets through some great walkways, one of which is opposite the front of the school. Children can be encouraged to cross the street at the pedestrian crossing, then go through that walkway and meet you at your vehicle on the street at the end of the walkway.
- The **drop-off zone** in front of the school is also a convenient area to pick up your children. All drivers must remain in the vehicles, the children are asked to come straight to the front of the school and look for their car. When they see their car the students are taught to go straight to the car if it is in the lane closest to the school buildings, or if the car is in the lane furthest away the students need to come down to Mrs Fraser at the marked traffic hump and she will cross them safely. To ensure everyone's safety with moving cars <u>no-one (adults or children) is to cross the drop-off zone in any other area than the part that Mrs Fraser is at.</u>
- The drop-off zone has two access lanes so you can turn into either the left or right lane depending on where you are going when you exit the drop off. If you are going to travel north up Hector Drive towards Rototuna Junior High then please use the left lane closest to the school. Always indicate your intention then turn left onto Hector Drive as you exit the zone.
- We ask that you remain in the lane you are in throughout the drop-off zone, it is dangerous to cross over the lanes.
- Mrs Fraser monitors the safety of this area, it is a very efficient process and we endeavour to keep it moving well. It is generally all cleared of cars by 3.15pm, so great for those prompt getaways!

MEET THE TEACHER EVENING - WEDNESDAY 17TH FEBRUARY, 2021 (WEEK 3)

We are very keen to continue to have close links between home and school, so we have arranged for a Meet the Teacher session for families, a great way to stay really connected with the school.

6.00pm - 6.30pm Ra & Earth families meet with their Teacher

6.30pm - 7.00pm Marama & Milky Way families meet with their Teacher

The different timings above allows those of you, with children in different year levels of the school, to get to each of the presentations relating to your children.

Please Note: Students are <u>not required</u> to attend "Meet the Teacher Evening" however, they are most welcome to play on the playground while they wait for you.

We have an <u>optional</u> 'Bring Your Own Device' procedure at school for Year 3-6 students only. We have very clear protocols around this which need to be adhered to. The Team Leaders and Teachers will outline these to families in this area of the school as part of their Meet the Teacher presentations. With the very hot weather we have introduced a Heat Plan at school. Usually our children go outside during the breaks to play with friends and enjoy the benefits of being active. We recognise that with the very hot weather this can pose some risks, especially around dehydration and heat related concerns. So on very hot days we will be having an indoor option for the children to use at break times, typically anything over 25 degrees in the forecast will trigger the Heat Plan.

We are fortunate that all our inside areas (*apart from the Matariki Hall*) are air conditioned so it allows for optimum learning and teaching conditions.

Teachers have planning to do before school in their classrooms and are unavailable to supervise any students arriving before 8.15am. LATE ARRIVALS (AFTER 8.55AM)

Have you ever arrived at a meeting late, everyone is settled in their chair, the presenter has welcomed them and is now outlining what the day has in store..... and as you walk in they all turn and look at you?

That is what it can be like for your child when they arrive late at school and their class is all settled. So please, we ask parents to ensure their children arrive at school with at least five minutes to spare, for them to organise themselves by hanging up their school bag and sorting their book bag independently.

We understand there may be rare occasions where your child arrives late at school

(after 8.55am). We require families to report to the School Office for your child to be issued a Late Card prior to heading to their learning areas. We appreciate your effort in ensuring your child/ren arrive at school in good time before the first bell at 8.55am.

PROCEDURE WHEN STUDENTS ARE AWAY DUE TO FAMILY HOLIDAY ETC

From time to time families wish to take their children out of school for various events not related to illness. Simply notifying the teacher/school verbally is not sufficient.

The correct procedure is to write or email the Principal (copy Carole Carter-Gregory) in order to follow the Education Act.

ALLERGIES/MEDICAL CONDITIONS

In the event of a medical emergency, if your child has a medical condition, is taking regular medicine/tablets or has an allergy (including sticking plasters etc), please advise the School Office (if you haven't already), so we can amend your records accordingly.

We also have several children in school with allergies and we have procedures in place to keep these children safe, including not sharing food/drink, washing tables, and hand washing before and after eating. Thank you for your cooperation in these matters.

We love to see families at school and appreciate the home and school partnership. However, we are finding that we have a number of "cold callers" arriving and expecting to see either a leadership person or a teacher. This can pose problems as we often have commitments elsewhere and can't do justice to any queries that you may have. We certainly don't want to stop the great communication in place, but would appreciate either a phone call or email so that we can make an appointment to give you the time needed to sort out any queries. This phone call or email will need to be done a day or two prior to the appointment.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

We are delighted with the large numbers of students who look really great by wearing their uniform in the correct manner.

Just for your information the school uniform expectations are below:

<u>ALL</u> students are expected to be wearing their full correct summer uniform.

- All students are to arrive at school and leave from school in their Te Totara Primary School uniform, including footwear.
- · Uniforms are to be worn clean, neat and tidy.
- · Students are encouraged to take pride in their school uniform and to wear it well.
- Hair is to be off the face, tied back if longer than the bottom of the collar, and be the natural hair colour.
- · Nail polish and cosmetics are not permitted.
- · Second hand uniforms may be available. Please see the notice board in the School Office for details.
- Any plain hair accessory is to be of a single school uniform colour red, white, black, green.
- · Variations in relation to the Human Rights Act may be negotiated with the Principal.
- \cdot All pupils are encouraged to use sunscreen at home before school and expected to wear the regulation school hat while outdoors. No hat play in the shade.
- $\cdot\,$ All uniform items should be clearly named.
- Plain black school sandals in summer (Terms 1&4) OR plain black school shoes in winter (Terms 2&3). No other colours on the sandal or shoe, just plain black.

JEWELLERY

Items of jewellery can be easily lost or damaged at school. They may also cause injury to the wearer or other students. For safety reasons items of jewellery are NOT to be worn. The school accepts no responsibility in the case of loss, damage or injury.

However, students may wear:

- a) One small earring stud per ear.
- b) A watch.
- c) A necklace of religious or cultural significance to be worn underneath clothing.
- d) A Medical Identification Tag as required.

NAMING OF SCHOOL UNIFORM

If an item of clothing is found out on the fields it can not be returned unless it is named.

FREE MEASLES, MUMPS & RUBELLA VACCINE

These last two years have highlighted the need to ensure our whānau and communities are safe from infectious diseases. Measles is about 8 times more contagious than COVID-19, and last year's outbreak is a reminder of just how quickly it can spread among unimmunised people. While we can't vaccinate against COVID-19 yet, we can protect against other infectious diseases like measles by being immunised.

Teenagers and young adults aged 15-30 are at greater risk of catching and spreading measles, as they are less likely to have been immunised as children.

District Health Boards (DHB) are leading a campaign targeting this age group for their **free Measles**, **Mumps and Rubella** (MMR) vaccine.
