EASTER HOLIDAYS ** SCHOOL CLOSED**

We open again on Wednesday 7th April as normal, school starts at 8.55am

Today is the last day of school before the Easter Holidays which start tomorrow. We have had queries about why the School is closed on Tuesday 6th April, the below wording is taken from the Ministry of Education website and may be of help:

Easter Tuesday

The Tuesday following Easter Monday is a school holiday (not a statutory holiday), meaning schools must not be open.

The terms and holidays are usually set so that Easter occurs during the first term break and the Easter Tuesday school holiday goes unnoticed. However, in some years Easter falls much earlier than usual such as in 1997, 2005, 2008, 2013 and 2016.

To have the first two-week break at Easter in those years would shorten the first term to only eight or nine weeks, instead of around 12 weeks, and mean that at least one of the other three terms would have to be correspondingly longer. As the Minister aims to set four terms of reasonably uniform length, in years when Easter falls particularly early, all or some of the Easter break will be during the first term.

Mondayisation

The public holidays for ANZAC Day (25 April) and Waitangi Day (6 February) are Monday-ised. This means that when either of these dates fall on a Saturday or Sunday, the corresponding public holiday will be observed on the Monday immediately following.

CHARTER AND ANNUAL PLAN

Today we are sending home a pamphlet outlining our Charter, Strategic and Annual Plan targets with the oldest or only student in the school.

Some information:

- The Charter and Strategic Plan is our four-year plan (*on one page*) to support our vision of Growing and Learning Together
- Our Annual Plan and targets are based on achievement results from the end of 2020 and Ministry of Education priorities. It sets out very specific actions, responsibilities, resourcing and timeframes to achieve our targets in 2021.
- Our goals are set above the Government expectations of 85% of students achieving at or above National Standards in Reading, Writing and Maths.

OUT-OF-ZONE ENROLMENTS PERIOD FOR 2021

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available on our school website by clicking the following link: www.tetotara.school.nz

The Board has determined that **20 places for New Entrant (Year 0) students** whose 5th Birthday falls within the enrolment period of **1st July - 14th December 2021**, are likely to be available to out-of-zone students

The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

The deadline for receipt of out-of-zone applications is **3.00pm on Friday 23rd April, 2021** and should be addressed to:

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot supervised by a Justice of the Peace, a Practising Lawyer or a Police Officer in accordance under Section 11G (1) of the Education Act 1989.

If a ballot for out-of-zone is required, it will be held on **Monday 10th May, 2021**. Parents will be informed of the outcome by **Wednesday 12th May, 2021**.

RAMADAN



TE TOTARA CODE OF BEHAVIOUR FOR PARENTS AND SUPPORTERS

We have a number of sporting teams in operation at the moment and also events that we are involved in. It is useful from time-to-time to remind our supporters and families of the guidelines we have established, in relation to what we expect of our families who are on the sidelines. We have a Code of Behaviour that originated in conjunction with Sport Waikato which outlines those expectations:

- Encourage children to take part in sport but do not force them.
- Focus on the children's effort and performance rather than whether they won or lost.
- Teach children that trying hard is more important than winning.
- Encourage fair and skilful players.
- Insist that they always compete according to the rules and respect officials and coaches' decisions.
- Never ridicule or shout at a child. Mistakes are part of learning and everyone loses sometime.
- Children learn from example so applaud all good performances and good sportsmanship including the opponents
- If you disagree with an official do not question the official in public. There is a standard procedure for complaints - see the manager or the meeting referee.
- Recognise the importance of volunteer officials, administrators and coaches who give their time so that your child can be involved.
- Remember children compete in sport for their enjoyment, not ours.
- Talk to your child. Do they enjoy their sport? Are they learning that doing their best, being sporting and having fun are important?
- Teach children to respect the effort of their opponents.
- Encourage children to think about the stars. Are they being respectful, self-managing, trying their best, always learning and making smart decisions.


