This is a reminder about the **Teacher Only Day** that is occurring on <u>Friday 4 June, 2021</u>. This day and the one in October this year were approved by our Board of Trustees and have been on our school calendars since the beginning of this year.

This Teacher Only Day is professional development for our teaching staff with all the other schools in our Rototuna / Chartwell/ Fairfield Cluster area. We will be off-site working in a large venue, as this involves over 600 teachers !

The focus of the day is the new Social Sciences Curriculum on Aotearoa New Zealand Histories. This curriculum is in draft form at the moment, we are one of the schools selected to teach with the draft document throughout Term 2. This is an exciting opportunity for Te Totara to help shape our national curriculum by giving the Ministry of Education feedback on the intent and learning activities.

The Teacher Only Day has a very full programme for our staff and contains new learning about our local Waikato history and significant sites, we will be working with some eminent presenters, and a very exciting resource website to assist our planning and content for the students will be launched. This is the culmination of an agreement with Naagti Wairere to share their knowledge and stories of this whenua and local area. This reflects a wonderful collaboration, we are very excited about this day for our staff.

We very much appreciate your understanding around the <u>school being closed on Friday 4 June</u>. This date was chosen as it is the Friday before Queens Birthday weekend with a public holiday on Monday 7th June, 2021. We are sure you will enjoy the slightly longer break for your family.

ALLERGIES/MEDICAL CONDITIONS

In the event of a medical emergency, if your child has a medical condition, is taking regular medicine/tablets or has an allergy (including sticking plasters etc), please advise the School Office (if you haven't already), so we can amend your records accordingly.

We also have several children in school with severe allergies and we have procedures in place to keep these children safe, including not sharing food/drink, washing tables, and hand washing before and after eating. Thank you for your cooperation in these matters.

MEDICATION PERMISSION SLIPS

From time-to-time it is necessary to administer medication to children at school. The Administration Team are happy to do this and follow the guidelines set out in the schools Administration of *Prescribed Medication Policy*. The Policy also requires parents/caregivers to complete a "Medicine Notification/Consent Form". This form is held at the School Office or can be downloaded from our school website <u>www.tetotara.school.nz</u> it is to be completed prior to any medication being administered. <u>ALL</u> medication must be held at the School Office.

ILLNESS AT SCHOOL - STAND DOWN TIMES REMINDER

The School Office has seen a few cases of diarrhoea and vomiting amongst students at Te Totara Primary School over the past week.

As this can be very easily transmitted, please ensure all unwell students are kept at home until **<u>48 hours after the diarrhoea and/or vomiting has stopped.</u>**

It is important to encourage good hand washing and drying.

Please see a Doctor if vomiting and/or diarrhoea is severe or the illness does not improve.
