I hope you are all well, safe and settled with your families in your Level 3 lockdown 'bubble.'

This is another extraordinary Term where we are having to be flexible with learning occurring at home and for a small number of learners onsite. We have very



limited staff numbers who are available for our 7 bubbles of 10 learners, a maximum of 70 onsite.

We are now full and sadly have had to decline some requests. This does weigh very heavily on my mind however I must follow the strict Health and Safety guidelines around this set by the Ministry of Education and Health.

It is hard at the moment to see the end in sight, I know the Minister of Education is consulting the education sector about the possibility of a partial reopening of schools, if that is safe. We do not know yet what that will look like. The concerns are about the age of our learners and that this would be bringing together the largest group of unvaccinated people, who would need to be carefully protected. So much to consider by the Government and the Ministry of Education before a return to site will happen.

So this is certainly a very different Term 4 for us all. I hope you are enjoying the Home Learning that is being shared by our hard-working staff. I have certainly seen some fun activities on offer as well as valuable core learning work.

As you continue to support your children at home, try to keep it simple; don't overcomplicate it. We are talking about a few tasks each day that build routines that the students themselves can manage. Try to make learning opportunities creative and based on the experience of being in the home.

I think often about you all, our fantastic Te Totara learners and family members. I send you my concern and best wishes in these challenging days.

Be kind to yourselves, give yourself permission to do a lot, some, or very little on some days, apart from just getting through. That is our main task, to stop the spread of this Covid 19 virus in order to get back to a 'new normal'.

Please don't hesitate to keep in touch with your child's teacher, myself, and other members of the Senior Leadership Team - Jo Stewart and Jennie Brook-Watt.

When I receive any updates regarding a return to school, I will be sure to be in touch with you all. We look forward to being back together soon.
