Kia ora te whanau

I hope you and your families are all doing well as we deal with this challenging time. There is a real sense of wanting to 'hunker down, stay safe and take care' in remaining close to our own homes and loved ones, so we don't expose ourselves to unnecessary risks through the next few weeks. I certainly understand that feeling, a need to live more quietly in order to just get through. Each day is a step closer to that 'more normal time' that the experts tell us is ahead.



In terms of what is happening in our school at the moment. We are in a similar position to most other schools in New Zealand where the outbreak is still on the rise. With the change to the contact tracing rules now it is only confirmed positive cases and household contacts who are required to self isolate. Currently we have a few positive cases who are self-isolating at home, most of these were not at school when they were infectious as they were already isolating as close contacts in a household.

All classes are now back at school with staff and families monitoring the children for symptoms. If we are concerned about any child's health we contact families to take them home. We have some way to go before the peak of this outbreak so we do expect to be informed by many more families about positive cases. From what we have seen the outbreak in our children is either asymptomatic or similar to a cold or sore throat with some high temperatures. Children seem to recover from symptoms quite quickly.

We have been advised by the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Health to be very aware of privacy considerations with the information we share. This is why the information shared will be of a general nature through our newsletters and Facebook page.

We do have a few staff away with family members isolating so we are using our bank of Guest Teachers to work with the classes. We have wonderful Guest Teachers who we call on at regular intervals. They are well known to our students who are very comfortable with them. I am proud of the resilience of our learners through this time.

I am so heartened by the trust you have put in the school by continuing to have your children learning and being with their friends onsite. This week our attendance has been between 88% and 91% everyday which is fantastic compared with many schools around us. Also a big 'thank you' to the way you continue to monitor your children for symptoms and respond so quickly if they are unwell. We very much appreciate the proactive way you are informing us.

If you do not have access to a computer, you are welcome to check your details with the School Office on (07) 853-0039.


UNWELL CHILDREN WHO NEED TO GO HOME

Our Administration team and teaching staff act in the very best interests of your child and their well-being is paramount. When children arrive at the School Office, and depending on the situation, most of the children are offered a rest in our Wellness Room and re-assessed before a phone call home; often they return to their classroom.

We understand many of our families have work commitments however, if you are phoned by the school to collect your child from school due to illness, it would be appreciated if you could arrange for their collection as soon as possible. For the privacy of other students, the School Office staff will collect your child from the Wellness Room when you arrive.

If your child is sick, please keep them at home until they are well. If your child has diarrhoea or vomiting we ask that they do not return to school unless they are well and have had **no further diarrhoea or vomiting for 48 hours prior to returning – these bugs can be highly contagious.**Thank you for your assistance.

My child is feeling unwell (e.g. cough, headache, sore throat etc). Can I still send them to school? Because these are all symptoms of Covid, please do not send your child to school. While these may be the normal bugs/sniffles that occur, we encourage you to get your child tested.

Physical lifting or transporting purchases for events to the school.

All kinds of skills are welcome and needed to make the PTA successful. This helps share responsibilities and load across more people.

What are the perks of being part of the PTA?

- Gain a great insight into the workings of the School
- Seeing the smiling faces of the children at Events

What happens at the AGM?

The AGM is where the Committee decides who will be on the Executive Team for the following year (Chair, Deputy Chair, Treasurer, Secretary and Communications Officer). These people liaise with the school around how the money will be spent e.g. new playground, tennis court roof etc and also that the school community are kept informed about PTA events, like Discos and Fun Runs.

What can I do to help?

You can take on an executive role, attend meetings as a committee member or help out at events, such as selling drinks at Disco's, Ice-block Days or to help plan other fun fundraising events.

The PTA would love to meet you, find out what you have to offer to help the school community come together and have some fun.

How much time is involved?

As much or as little as you are able to give to the PTA. If you take on an executive position, you will be required to attend the majority of the meetings (approx 8 x one hour meetings per year). The PTA also needs plenty of people to help at events.
