Kia ora o te whanau,

As I said in last week's newsletter I would give you an indication of what our return to school in Term 2 will look like. Discussions have been held with school leadership and Board of Trustees. We looked at areas of risk and thought carefully about ways to ensure we could minimise this.



With the Covid Omicron outbreak moving past its peak in a highly vaccinated population, we can move back to some of our more normal community functions. We still need to be mindful that Covid will still be around and also the usual 'ills and chills' of winter will be with us, such as colds, flu and the RSV virus that can be quite nasty for some children. We will also be following all Ministry of Education and Public Health advice. We are hoping to return in the 'Orange Covid traffic light' setting.

To that effect the following guidelines are what we are planning for the start of Term 2:

- Our school gates will be open from 8:15am to 3:15pm each day for our students to come into school. (Students who need to arrive earlier or stay later need to be enrolled at Before or After School Care.)
- We will be welcoming our families back into the school grounds at the drop-off and pick-up times, however we will be asking you to please wear face masks to protect our learners and staff at this time, with winter viruses and Covid still circulating.
- If any family members are unwell with any winter colds or virus, then we ask that you drop off your child at the school gate, until you are well again.
- There will be one morning tea break and one lunch break for our staff and students.
- Mask wearing inside for our staff and Year 3-6 students will remain for as long as we are directed to, by the Ministry of Education.
- Some community events which will include whanau will be able to occur e.g. Art Exhibition on Thursday 12th May 2022 from 3.15pm-6.30pm and the Te Totara X Challenge in Week 8.
- Other events will slowly return. School assemblies will begin after Queen's Birthday weekend when we see how everything is going and what protocols we need to put into place.

We will take care to be safe with our events by opening up slowly to some that are inside and carry larger numbers and more risk. We have done so well this year in keeping the school learning areas running smoothly with our regular and guest teachers. Everything will be closely monitored and if anything changes we can be 'nimble' and respond by either tightening things up or allowing more interactions. If Public Health Orders change via Government and Ministry of Education guidelines then we will need to follow these at the time.

I will confirm these arrangements via our school app, website and Facebook page at the end of the holiday break.

Learning onsite is our main focus to keep our well being high and our learners happy. We currently have over 90% of our learners back in our classrooms.

Let's keep moving forward together, thank you so much for your trust in us.

Marhaba (welcome in Arabic)

Ramadan, the Islamic faith's holy month, started on Saturday, April 2nd. This is one of the most important times of the year for Muslim families. During this month, practicing Muslims will observe a strict fast from dawn to dusk. This special time will last 30 days and end at sundown on Sunday 1st May, 2022.

Ramadan's beginning and end is determined by something really quite beautiful: the sighting of the new moon. For a short

time at sunset as the new moon moves away from the sun, a super slim crescent will be visible. Muslims call it the "Shawwal Moon". "Shawwal Moon" is the start of Eid al-Fitr, also called the "Festival of Breaking the Fast." It's a special holiday celebrated by Muslims across the world, and involves all kinds of events.

OUT-OF-ZONE ENROLMENTS FOR 2022

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available on our school website <u>www.tetotara.school.nz</u>

The Board has determined the following places are likely to be available to out-of-zone students from 2022 onwards. Enrolment period: **1st July - 15th December, 2022**:

20 places for Year 0 students (whose 5th Birthday falls within the above enrolment period)

- 5 places for Year 2 students
- 1 place for a Year 3 student
- 6 places for Year 5 students

The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone. For students seeking enrolment within the above enrolment period, the deadline for receipt of out-of-zone applications is **3.00pm on Monday 25th April**, **2022** and should be emailed to: *receptionist@tetotara.school.nz*.

Parents of students who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year. Students who live in the home zone are entitled to enrol at the school. An OUTZ Application Form and the order of priority for OUTZ applications can be found on our school website <u>www.tetotara.school.nz</u> under "Enrolment".

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot supervised by a Justice of the Peace, a Practicing Lawyer or a Police Officer in accordance with Section 11G (1) of the Education Act 1989. If a ballot for out-of-zone is required, it will be held on <u>Monday 9th May</u>, 2022. Parents will be informed of the outcome by Wednesday 11th May, 2022.
