OUT-OF-ZONE ENROLMENTS FOR 2022

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available on our school website **www.tetotara.school.nz**

The Board has determined the following places are likely to be available to out-of-zone students from 2022 onwards. Enrolment period: **1st July - 15th December**, **2022**:

20 places for Year 0 students (whose 5th Birthday falls within the above enrolment period)

5 places for Year 2 students

1 place for a Year 3 student

6 places for Year 5 students



The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone. For students seeking enrolment within the above enrolment period, the deadline for receipt of out-of-zone applications is **3.00pm on Monday 25th April**, **2022** and should be emailed to: *receptionist@tetotara.school.nz*.

Parents of students who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year. Students who live in the home zone are entitled to enrol at the school. An OUTZ Application Form and the order of priority for OUTZ applications can be found on our school website <u>www.tetotara.school.nz</u> under "Enrolment".

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot supervised by a Justice of the Peace, a Practicing Lawyer or a Police Officer in accordance with Section 11G (1) of the Education Act 1989. If a ballot for out-of-zone is required, it will be held on <u>Monday 9th May</u>, 2022. Parents will be informed of the outcome by Wednesday 11th May, 2022.

SCHOOL UNIFORM FOR TERMS 2 & 3

At this time of the year we are noticing an increasing need for warmer clothing.

Although not compulsory we advise wearing **<u>black</u> under garments** i.e. singlet, long sleeve polypropylene. Also, our winter uniform requirements are plain black socks or tights and plain black shoes.

A number of students are appearing with different coloured jackets/sweatshirts.

Children are asked to wear the red Te Totara Polar Fleece top as prescribed only.

We understand families may still be sorting their children's winter uniforms due to the stores being closed and we would appreciate it if your children <u>could please be in the correct full winter school</u> <u>uniform after the school holidays.</u>

<u>ALL</u> students are expected to arrive at school and leave from school in their correct Te Totara Primary School Uniform, including footwear.

- Uniforms are to be worn clean, neat and tidy. Please clearly name your uniform items.
- Students are encouraged to take pride in their school uniform and to wear it well.
- Hair is to be off the face, tied back if longer than the bottom of the collar, and be the natural hair colour.
- Nail polish and cosmetics are not permitted.
- Second hand uniforms may be available. Please see the School Office for details.
- Variations in relation to the Human Rights Act may be negotiated with the Principal.



- All pupils are encouraged to use sunscreen at home before school and expected to wear the regulation school hat while outdoors. No hat play in the shade (Terms 1 & 4).
- All uniform items should be clearly named.
- Extras for warmth such as polyprops or singlets, must be plain black.
- Plain black school sandals in summer (Terms 1&4) OR plain black school school shoes in the winter (Terms 2&3). No other colours on the sandal or shoe, just plain black.
- Any hair accessory is to be <u>plain</u> and of a single school uniform colour either red, white, black or green.







A reminder regarding the red Sports Polo Shirt with the words "Te Totara Primary School" printed on the back is <u>NOT</u> the everyday school uniform. This Sports Shirt is for children who are part of a school sports team.

<u>These jackets are only to be worn to and from school.</u> They are NOT to take place of our red school polar fleece which are to be worn in class.
