In one instance in a Year 5/6 class last week, we asked that the students who were able to wear masks last term resume wearing them, until there was a decrease in the winter illnesses that we were seeing. This may have to happen in other classes as we go on through the winter. Please respond in your usual positive manner if this happens in your child's class.

It is currently very difficult to get enough guest teachers to teach classes when our teachers are away. We are very much trying to keep our fantastic workforce and your children safe and healthy in these instances. It is very important to us to have a teacher with every class, every day. Many of the schools around us have had to do 'year levels off site' due to a lack of staff to teach them. We are being very proactive in trying to avoid that, so we certainly value your support when we ask for it.

Just a reminder to our families around mask wearing protocol in the school grounds. In the guidelines for this term we have asked you to **please wear face masks to protect our learners and staff at this time,** with winter viruses and Covid still circulating. Due to our large student and parent population we need to be very cautious around this. If any family members are unwell with any winter colds or virus, then we ask that you drop off your child at the school gate, until you are well again.

Working together, we can get through the winter illness season by using all our best defenses to stay healthy and look after our staff and students.



# LEARNING PLANS ONLINE ON FRIDAY 17TH JUNE, 2022 (NEXT WEEK) ACCESS THESE THROUGH THE PARENT PORTAL

A Learning Plan for each student will be uploaded to the online Parent Portal on <u>Friday 17 June 2022</u>. However, if your child started at school in Term 2 you will not receive a Learning Plan yet.

We will send you an email on Friday 17th June by 1.00pm using the email address we have on file, this will contain your User ID and Password details for the Parent Portal. Once you have successfully logged-in, we recommend you change your password. Please check your spam or junk folder for this email if you do not receive it.



The work involved in developing these Learning Plans is immense and reflects our goal of developing a personalised plan for each student. Much thought and consideration has gone into these Learning Plans. We have managed to include a lot more of each child's comments and goals, to ensure they have an increased sense of ownership of their Learning Plan.

#### We strongly advise that you:

- Go through the Learning Plan with your child
- Look especially at the "Where To Next" and "Goals set by Student, Parent and Teacher" sections and incorporate these into supporting learning at home.

#### LEARNING PLAN CHANGES

There have been some changes to the Learning Plans this year. Our modified Learning Plans now have a table for each of the Reading, Writing and Mathematics Curriculum areas. The table has green coloured boxes to indicate where children are expected to be working at, according to the New Zealand Curriculum Levels at the Mid-Year and End-of-Year assessment points.

The placement of a red star on the graph indicates where your child is presently working at. Each table is followed by Comment and Next Step boxes for your information.

\*Please be aware that every child is on their own learning pathway and the most important consideration is that they are making steady progress through the curriculum.

English as a Second Language (E.S.O.L) students' Learning Plans do not have the green progress line; they use the English Language Learning Progressions.

A 'Reach For the STARS' continuum has also been added into the Plans. Learnina Teachers place a red star on the continuum where your child is presently working, in regards

to each of our STARS. This continuum relates to your child's year level only. For instance, Year 1 expectations of independence in Smart Decisions will be different to the expectations of independence in Smart Decisions of a Year 6 student.

In our Junior Learning Plans we have added the Better Start Literacy Testing Data. Better Start Literacy is a new Reading Programme being taught in all Year 1 classrooms and also in Room 3. The other Year 0 teachers begin their BSLA training soon. The testing data will be added to these tables over the course of the year. On each box there is a proficiency level which means when the proficiency score has been reached this test will not be repeated.

On all Learning Plans there are **blue hyperlinks** which you can click on that will take you to an explanation of that particular section or word. #### 2022 BOARD OF TRUSTEES ELECTIONS

Board of Trustees elections are coming up in September 2022 and we wanted to give everyone plenty of opportunity to think about standing for the Board.

#### What is a school Board of Trustees?

Almost all state and state integrated schools in New Zealand have a board of trustees. School board membership includes parent representatives, a staff representative, a student representative (where there are students above Year 9) and the Principal. Your Board may also include other types of trustees.

#### Who can become a trustee?

Parents, caregivers and people from the wider community can put their name forward to be on a school board during the Board of Trustee elections.



#### What do Trustees do?

The Board is accountable to its parents and community and for student progress and achievement. Here are some specific things a board does:

- Sets the strategic direction and plans for the school and monitors the school's progress against them
- Monitors and evaluates student progress.

- Oversees the management of staff, property, finances, curriculum and administration.
- Ensures that the educational needs and aspirations of Maori learners, Pasifika learners and learners with special learning and behaviour needs are identified, planned for and met.
- Fulfils the intent of the Treaty of Waitangi by valuing and reflecting New Zealand's dual cultural heritage.
- Appoints and supports the principal and assesses their performance.

#### What skills do trustees need?

Trustees are active leaders in their schools and need to work well in a team, ask challenging questions and have good communications skills. Boards need a balance of skills and experiences around the table to ensure effective processes for planning, monitoring, reporting and reviewing of the school's performance are in place.

#### What help do school Trustees get?

New Zealand School Trustees Association provides free advice around employment and governance, support and resources. NZSTA also provides a variety of professional development opportunities for trustees.




Some of our staff will be attending this hui (meeting) and it is also open to parents and/or caregivers to attend.
