TEACHER PAID UNION MEETINGS -SCHOOL REMAINS OPEN

Under law, teachers can meet to discuss Union matters twice a year for up to two hours. The New Zealand Education Institute (NZEI) has called their first meetings for teachers in the Hamilton area on a couple of dates in March: **Wednesday 20th March** from 9.30am - 10.30am & **Wednesday 27th March, 2024** from 9.30am - 10.30am or 1:30pm-2:30pm. These meetings are just over an hour long so the staff will be back on site for the next time block of the school day.

Our teachers have in past years been very helpful in rostering themselves on different meeting times so that there are at least two teachers in each team at school during the meeting times, ensuring that there is adequate supervision on these days for the children. On these days we will run different learning programmes at these times to help cater for the children. We will be well prepared for this day. Please send your children to school as normal.

With people travelling overseas again, there's a risk that someone with measles could unknowingly bring the disease back to Aotearoa.

Measles spreads easily and quickly, usually between people who are unimmunised or only partially immunised. It can be serious and life threatening. In the 2019 measles outbreak in Aotearoa, more than 30% of the people infected had to be admitted to hospital.

The best protection against measles is the free MMR vaccine. It will protect you and your whānau, and prevent the virus from spreading.

You will be protected against measles if you:

- **had 2 doses of the MMR vaccine**
- **had measles before**
- **were born before 1 Jan 1969**

If you're unsure if you or your tamariki have had any or both doses of the MMR vaccine, check by calling your Family Doctor. Alternatively, check your Plunket Well Child Tamariki Ora Book. If you're still not sure, be safe and get immunised – there are no safety concerns with having an extra dose. MMR vaccines are free at your local health provider and many pharmacies.

As measles still occurs in many countries, if you're travelling overseas these holidays it's especially important to be immunised to prevent the risk of being unknowingly infected and causing an outbreak in Aotearoa on your return.

TE TOTARA CELLPHONE RULE - COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

At Te Totara our approach towards cellphones is "away for the day", meaning the device should be **turned off, and handed in to the teacher to be locked away during the school day.**

We strongly recommend students **do not** bring communication devices to school with them. If a student does bring their cellphone for emergency contact, it **must** be handed to the teacher when they arrive at school to be locked away.



We understand that some parents like their children to have a phone to be in contact with them after school and these can be collected from the classroom teacher at the end of the day. If a parent of caregiver needs to contact their child urgently during the day, they should call the front office 07 853 0039

If students do make the decision to bring a cellphone onto the school grounds, they do so at their own risk. The school is not responsible for any loss or damage caused to any cellphone or communication device.

If we see or know of a student using a personal digital device (including smart watches) without permission during the school day, we will confiscate it. It will be placed in the office to be collected at the end of the day by a parent or guardian.


Please Note: Aquatics will be charged after your child's class has had their lessons.

AN UPDATE FROM KINDO REGARDING ONLINE EFT-POS PAYMENTS

We know the start of the school year is always extremely busy and hope it has gone smoothly for you.

At KINDO, we pride ourselves on offering a diverse array of payment methods to make your transactions as convenient as possible. Our current options include credit/debit cards, bank transfers, POLi, and Online Eftpos.

We want to keep you informed about an important update regarding payment options. Due to unforeseen circumstances, we've encountered a significant increase in costs associated with processing payments through Online Eftpos for high-value transactions. Our goal has always been to provide you with the best possible service without imposing additional fees.

To maintain this commitment, we've made the decision to temporarily suspend the use of Online Eftpos for top up transactions exceeding \$250. This change is effective immediately and will remain in place until we can find a solution that aligns with our values of affordability and convenience for our customers. 
