

This amazing effort is thanks to our hot composting system, which breaks down food waste quickly and safely. Our composting system is predator-free system and super effective!

A big thank you goes out to the Hamilton City Council's Waste Minimisation Fund and the Waikato Regional Council's Enviroschools programme for helping fund this project. With their support, we've been able to build a composting system that helps our school reduce waste and grow healthier gardens.

Every apple core, sandwich crust, and banana peel you've composted has made a difference. Keep up the awesome work, Te Totara! Together, we're helping the planet—one lunchbox at a time.



### CHECK OUT OUR KUMARA HARVEST

Take a look at our huge kumara crop. They need to cure (dry) for two weeks before we can start eating and sharing them. This was an amazing crop from a 1m by 1.5m plot.

The biggest kumara weighed a whopping 2.2 kilos!

Leaves are fantastic for our compost. Rake up your autumn leaves at home, please bring them to school.



- 1. Fill up a bag of leaves at home
- 2. Bring them to school and empty your bag in the maara kai between the fence and the carbon store area

- 4. Take your empty bag home and fill it up again
