

#### SCHOOL START TIME - 8.55AM


Just a reminder to our families that our school day starts promptly with the bell at 8.55am. That is when the classroom roll is taken. If students are not in class by this time they will be marked LATE and will need to sign-in at the School Office. We do monitor students' absence and lateness to school which is discussed at our weekly Administration Meeting.



#### MATHS CURRICULUM NEWS

After our Teacher Only Day with Bruce Moody on 3rd June I wanted to share some information around the changes that have been made in the new curriculum.

Bruce Moody started working with Te Totara in 2013 and has huge knowledge and understanding of the teaching of Maths. He has guided and helped teachers develop their teaching skills and knowledge in Maths teaching which resulted in Te Totara's high achievement results over the years.



Our new Maths Curriculum, which we have been using for the past 6 months, has moved from a child centred readiness for learning focus to being focused on knowledge that **needs to be known** by the end of a year level. This means that there is now maths work a child **needs** to know by the end of the year.

A lot of the achievement expectations from the 2007 curriculum have been moved to a younger age group:

For example:

- Adding and subtracting numbers up to at least 100 (e.g., 43 28, 37 + 18) was year 4 and 5 learning and is now the end of Year 3
- Adding and subtracting unit fractions with same denominators  $(\frac{1}{6} + \frac{1}{6} + \frac{1}{6} \frac{3}{6})$  was year 5 and is now year 3.
- Multiplying 3 digit by 2 digit numbers was Year 8 learning and is now year 6 learning.
- Using the order of operations was Year 8 learning and is now year 6 learning.
- Adding and subtracting whole numbers and decimals to two decimal places (e.g., 250.11 + 135.29 = 385.4) was Year 8 learning and is now Year 6.
- finding a fraction or percentage of a whole number where the answer is a whole number (e.g. ¾ of 48; 30% of \$150) was Year 8 and is now year 6

Times tables changes:

- Year 2's now need to be able to see the relationship between skip counting and the 2's,5's and 10's multiplication facts.
- Year 3's now need to know the 2,3,5 and 10 times tables and division facts. This was year 4.
- Year 4's now need to know the 4 and 6 times tables and division facts. This was year 5.
- Year 5's now need to know the 7s, 8s, and 9s times tables and division facts.
- Year 6's now need to know all times tables and division facts to  $10 \times 10$ .

Our teachers and support staff are working hard to help our tamariki achieve the required learning. With the new curriculum expectations, your child's results may look different. This is to be expected as we work through the changes in the new document over the next few years. Curriculum change can take a long period of time to adjust to, and as much as we want our children to be where they need to be, according to the new curriculum, for some of our children this will take time and careful teaching. We appreciate your patience as we continue to grow our understanding and knowledge of the new curriculum phases.

#### **SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS - SEPTEMBER 2025**

#### What is a School Board?

Almost all state and state integrated schools in New Zealand have a School Board. Our School Board membership includes 5x Parent Elected Representatives, 1x Staff Elected Representative and the Principal.

#### Who can become a Board Member?

Parents, caregivers and people from the wider community can put their name forward to be on a School Board during the Board elections.

#### What do Board Members do?

The Board is accountable to its parents and community and for student progress and achievement. Here are some specific things a School Board does:

- Sets the strategic direction and plans for the school and monitors the school's progress against them.
- Monitors and evaluates student progress
- Oversees the management of staff, property, finances, curriculum and administration.
- Ensures that the educational needs and aspirations of Maori learners, Pasifika learners and learners with special learning and behaviour needs are identified, planned for and met.
- Fulfils the intent of the Treaty of Waitangi by valuing and reflecting New Zealand's dual cultural heritage.
- Appoints and supports the Principal and assesses their performance.

#### What skills do Board Members need?

Board Members are active leaders in their schools and need to work well in a team, ask challenging questions and have good communications skills. Boards need a balance of skills and experiences around the table to ensure effective processes for planning, monitoring, reporting and reviewing the school's performance are in place.

#### What help do Board Members get?

New Zealand School Trustees Association provides free advice around employment and governance, support and resources. NZSTA also provides a variety of professional development opportunities for trustees.

The email will come from eTap and contain your User ID and Password details for using the Parent Portal. Please check your spam or junk folder for this email if you do not receive it. <u>Make a note of your login/password details for next time</u>. Once you have been able to log-in, we suggest that you change your password. If you have logged into the Parent Portal, before you can use the same User ID and Password you were provided with.

- Look especially at the "Next Steps" and "STARS Goal set by Student, Teacher and Family" sections and use these to support learning at home.

If you do not have access to a computer, please call the School Office on (07) 853-0039 and we will arrange for a printed copy of the Learning Plan for your family.
