*** MID TERM BREAK *** MONDAY 11TH AUGUST - SCHOOL CLOSED



What It's Like to be on the Te Totara Primary School Board?

I have been a Board member for six years now and I wanted to share my experience.



Te Totara has a very strong Leadership Team and because the school is run with such efficient, high standards, the role of the Board members is one of support as we oversee the running of the school. We do have to make decisions and cast our votes during meetings, but this job is made easy by the amount of information and guidance we are given by the Senior Management Team. Time wise, Board matters average about 3–4 hours a month.

We have a monthly Board meeting which runs for about 1hr -1.5 hours where we are kept up-to-date on everything that is happening within the school and making sure we're on track with finances and the school Charter. Prior to the meeting, we need to read through the paperwork which is sent the week before. These reports are discussed at the meeting and reading them takes me about 1.5 hours.

Occasionally, there are extra commitments like being present at community events, attending the odd extra meeting or being involved in some interesting and relevant professional development, but generally, it's a pretty easy gig.

If you would like the opportunity to support Te Totara and the wonderful staff who are teaching and caring for our children, then you might like to consider joining the Board.

If you are an eligible voter and the school has your email address on file, you will receive a "Call for Nominations" email on 18th July from Schooled Education, and via post for those we don't have email addresses for.

ROUTINE VISION & HEARING CHECKS IN SCHOOL Wednesday 13th August, 2025 @ 9.30am

Information on Vision and Hearing Checks in School+



Vision & Hearing Technicians from Community and Southern Rural Health will be visiting our school. The objective of the test is to identify previously undetected vision and hearing defects. Which children are routinely checked?

- Children who have **not** completed vision and hearing checks as part of their B4 School Check
- Children absent from previous visit, require retests or follow ups
- New immigrants

If any parents/caregivers <u>do not</u> want their child to be checked, or their child is currently under specialist care for a vision or hearing defect, they should let the school know.






