HEALTH CURRICULUM LEARNING

During Term 4 in your child's class we will be teaching the personal safety programme called "**Keeping Ourselves Safe**". In the Year 0-3 classes the unit is called "Knowing What to Do" and in the Year 4-6 classes it is titled "Getting Help".

Keeping Ourselves Safe has been designed to give children the skills to cope in situations involving abuse. It has three overall aims:

- To develop and strengthen children's skills to keep themselves safe with other people;
- To support and encourage abused children to get help from caring adults;
- To make teachers and parents more aware of the need to keep children safe from abuse by adults or other children.

The **Keeping Ourselves Safe** units will be taught by your child's teacher, with help from the local Police Education Officer as required.

To be successful, **Keeping Ourselves Safe** needs your help and support. Your child will have Home Activities to work on with you.

It is important that you participate as much as possible and talk to your child about what they have been learning. This will help reinforce the messages the school is giving, and help your child to use his or her new skills with confidence.

We recently got approached by VisTab. This company is providing a fully



automated sign-in and sign-out system for our pupils, staff, relieving teachers and casual visitors to the school. VisTab replaces the paper visitor books (at the front desk) and provides a real time, cloud based, touch screen procedure that is easy for all to use. In the event of an emergency or an evacuation the school immediately knows who has left the school since the roll call and who has come into the school at any one time. Information for authorised persons can also be accessed separately through a smart phone or laptop from the evacuation assembly point (or from anywhere in the world). The system comes at no cost to schools - as local businesses are asked to sponsor this system. Sponsors get to have their logo displayed on the front screen of the tablet for all to see. An average size School gets between 3000 -4500 hits per year. Watch this clip, go to the next step, and enter your company.
